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Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 March 2019

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2019. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The object of the charity is to promote the relief of older people in any manner deemed by law to be charitable in East Grinstead and surrounding rural parts of West Sussex.

In the short term, the charity's key aim is to secure larger accommodation for the Charity to be able to grow and expand the services and activities it offers within its stated objectives.

The charity measures achievements against its objectives by way of regular meetings with the budget holders and feedback from members, so that the services adapt, where possible, to meet members' needs.

Vision

A society in which everyone can enjoy a long and fulfilled life.

Mission

To work with and for local older people across our area to make a real and positive difference to their wellbeing and quality of life.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Significant activities

The charity provides five main services:-

Swan Mead Activity Centre

Swan Mead Activity Centre is a centre for older people who are independent to low need, where individuals are able to meet in a social environment, be entertained and enjoy a freshly prepared two course lunch.

Activities are available throughout the week, including quizzes, exercise and computer lessons, music and visiting entertainers, speakers and presentations. During the year over four thousand five hundred lunches were served to members at Swan Mead activity centre compared to 3,200 during 2017/2018.

Grants of £44,983 (2018: £48,751) were received from Mid Sussex District Council and West Sussex County Council towards the provision of the activity centre and associated services. Other activities in the community include Zumba, Tai Chi and a swimming group. The remaining costs of £64,069 (2018: £67,014) were funded by participants' contributions, further restricted grants for computer lessons (received prior year), chair exercises and Christmas activities, and the charity's unrestricted funds.

Trips, Outings and holidays

This consists of the organisation of outings and day trips for members along with members' holidays. The cost of these events, including the organiser's salary and a share of support costs, was £66,130 (2018: £78,001). Stricter cost controls together with using different suppliers has allowed us to reduce the overheads of this service.

Participants contributed £34,855 (2018: £47,515) towards these costs. A reduction of a holiday destination and improved prices have affected these figures. Grants for this purpose of £4,067 (2018: £1,000) were utilised during the year. The remaining costs of £27,208 (2018: £29,486) were funded out of the charity's unrestricted funds.

For an example of the popularity of these excursions and holidays during the year, over 34 older people enjoyed a day trip out to Winchester Christmas market, 43 went to Eastbourne for a Christmas lunch and over 25 had a week away in Wales, in some cases their first holiday for many years.

With the offer of free buses from a local organisation, we have now been able to offer shorter trips (within an hour's drive from East Grinstead) to local attractions with nearly 50 people taken to places such as the Gatwick Museum and the Hawth Theatre at Crawley.

Short Breaks for Carers service

The Short Breaks for Carers service is provided on the 1st and 3rd Saturday of each month throughout the year, for persons living with dementia and frail older people so that their carers can enjoy a well-earned break from their caring duties. There were over one hundred and thirty attendances during the year, slightly down on the 140 during 2018, reflecting the deteriorating health of some clients who were passed to a higher needs service together with the changing needs of Carers. It has been identified that some Carers would prefer more respite during the weekdays something we are currently looking into and trying to assist with.

Funding of £14,450 (2018: £15,725) was awarded from a West Sussex County Council grant for this purpose, with the balance of the total costs of £5,741 (2018: £6,460) being funded out of participants' contributions and the charity's unrestricted funds.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES Significant activities

The Help at Home service

The Help at Home service taken over by Age UK East Grinstead & District in 2009, continues to support older people by providing regular domestic help with housework tasks including routine cleaning, bed change, laundry and ironing, as well as shopping, but also provides an invaluable benefit of enabling clients to remain living independently at home. The service provided is specially tailored to the needs of older people who trust Age UK East Grinstead & District to deliver this and wider welfare and social contact which other domestic service organisations do not. Whilst this service is paid for by the service users, the full cost exceeds the income by £13,981 (2018: £12,881), which is funded by the charity's unrestricted funds, supporting this and other services tailored to the local community.

Community Outreach

This service was introduced in January 2018. Our Co-ordinator visits the more rural areas of our community advising older residents of the services available which can be provided by Age UK East Grinstead & District and linking them to statutory and voluntary groups that may offer solutions to specific needs. This has the double effect of reducing isolation and loneliness. Costs of £10,307 (2018: £5,811), including a share of support costs, were funded by restricted grants .

Public benefit

The trustees have had regard to the Charity Commission guidance on public benefit. The services provided by Age UK East Grinstead and District have been shown to improve the mental and physical health of older people, and to delay the onset of dementia, and therefore the trustees consider these services to be for the public benefit.

Volunteers

Activities assisted by the invaluable contribution of our volunteers include outings, day trips and members' holidays, aiding the enjoyment of the members' visit to the day centre whether through serving refreshments, supporting participation in group activities, playing cards or just taking the time to chat with members.

STRATEGIC REPORT

Financial review

Reserves policy

The charity's total reserves at 31 March 2019 were £771,504, of which £20,375 represents restricted funds.

Unrestricted reserves were £751,129. Of this, £606,275, comprising an investment portfolio of £501,301, bank balances of £103,469 and other assets £1,505, has been designated by the Trustees to cover the rent, service charges and insurance over the period of the 20 year lease of Glen Vue Community Hub, Railway Approach, East Grinstead beginning 3 May 2019. This arose from the donation of the investment portfolio of Lingfield Lodge Trust prior to its closure.

In addition, the Trustees have designated £40,000 from unrestricted funds to cover redundancy and other costs should there be a need to close down the charity.

Remaining unrestricted reserves of £104,854 comprise bank balances and cash of £112,585 and net current liabilities of £7,731. These represent approximately 5.5 months' average unrestricted expenditure. It is the charity's aim to maintain general funds to cover 6 months' of running costs. The charity's future plans to sustain and improve its income and hence build its reserves to a secure level are set out below.

Total income for the year - £971,155

Gross surplus for the year, excluding unrealised investment gains and before allocating support costs - £724,844. Support costs for the year (including Governance) - £56,070.

Net operating surplus for the year - £668,774. In addition, there are unrealised investment gains of £21,757.

The net surplus comprised a surplus on restricted funds of £7,966, a surplus on the designated Lingfield Lodge Trust donation of £606,275 (of which £21,757 comprised unrealised investment gains), and a surplus on other unrestricted funds of £76,290.

The Trustees recognise that the services currently provided are only sustainable if the current level of grants and donations can be maintained. During this financial year Age UK East Grinstead benefited from a very large donation from another charity which was closing down, something that is not expected to be repeated..

The Trustees have taken steps to help protect all sources of income including adopting a detailed budget for the year 2019-20 and a strategic plan for the next three years to demonstrate how the future performance can be improved as needed. Control of costs, debt control and cash flow are paramount to the continued survival of the Charity.

Principal risks and uncertainties

These documents recognise that, whilst the current economic climate is regarded as challenging; many charities in a variety of sectors are finding it increasingly difficult to secure the funding required from traditional sources to maintain their service provision. There are also changes planned in the way grants from Councils such as West Sussex and Mid Sussex are tendered for and reductions in sums available.

The charity has additional challenges in that the Help at Home service, which as stated is not funded by grants, has to succeed in an increasingly competitive commercial environment.

Our Outreach service, another valuable community based project, is expensive to run when compared to the reach to older people it actually makes.

The move to Glen Vue Community Hub with the agreed 20 year lease from 3 May 2019 has been negotiated with West Sussex County Council to contain 5 year break clauses, should the Charity be unable to financially maintain its presence at Glen Vue. Additional costs are expected with the move to larger premises, as basic as increased utilities costs for example together with the change of use and increased usage of the kitchen and other facilities within the building. Other costs such as maintenance of a larger property will be required, and increased costs of personnel - a Caretaker.

STRATEGIC REPORT

Principal risks and uncertainties

Successful grant applications for specific projects such as the Outreach Service have gone some way to support and improve the raising of the profile of the Charity together with regular donations from organisations and individuals.

Investment Risk

The investment portfolio is professionally managed by independent investment advisers for income and capital growth on a medium to low risk profile.

Future plans

Since the year end, the charity has moved to Glen Vue Community Hub on Railway Approach, East Grinstead. Sufficient funding for the rent payable over the next 20 years has been secured, through the donation from Lingfield Lodge Trust. Other financial and operational consequences of the move include:

- additional staff
- improving the IT
- decoration costs and ongoing maintenance and repairs
- new flooring in the dining area, which can now also be used for dance classes, together with furniture for offices and the day centre.

A grant application of £24,000 has been made to Mid Sussex District Council to cover these.

There are also opportunities to bring all the exercise classes in house. These include Zumba Gold and Tai Chi, which currently operate out of Chequer Mead, and the introduction of a new exercise class: Paracise.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

Age UK East Grinstead & District was registered as a company limited by guarantee on 8 September 2008. Age Concern East Grinstead was originally established on 27 October 1950 and registered as a charity on 18 February 1972. The assets of the original unincorporated association were transferred into a company limited by guarantee on 1 October 2009.

Age UK East Grinstead & District is governed by the company's Articles of Association as updated by special resolution at an EGM on 16 December 2016.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

Trustees are recruited and appointed by existing trustees. Their appointment is confirmed at the following annual general meeting.

Organisational structure

The charity has an executive committee as at 31 March 2019 consisting of eight trustees and representatives of the local funding authorities, who meet at least four times a year. The Trustees come from a variety of backgrounds relevant to the work of the charity and are responsible for the overall management and control of the charity.

Decision making

The day to day management of the charity is delegated to Barry Gilbert, Chief Operations Manager, the senior manager of the organisation.

Induction and training of new trustees

All new trustees have been given an induction to the Charity by the Chair, together with clear roles and responsibilities. Training classes have also been arranged such as good governance.

Key management remuneration

The management team comprises the Chief Operations Manager together with two subordinate managers. A Finance Co-ordinator supports the team. Salaries are set at a level that the charity can sustain.

Affiliation to Age UK

Age UK East Grinstead & District is a brand partner of Age UK, this allows Age UK East Grinstead, branding rights, information exchange and access to promotional material. It also limits Age UK East Grinstead to the agreed geographical area of East Grinstead and the surrounding district.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 March 2019

1. STATUTORY INFORMATION

Age UK East Grinstead & District is a charitable company, limited by guarantee, incorporated in England & Wales. The address of its registered office can be found in the Trustees' Report under **Reference and Administrative Details**. The charitable company is a public benefit entity.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention with the exception of investments which are included at market value, as modified by the revaluation of certain assets.

Critical accounting judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty

The Trustees consider that the date of the donation from Lingfield Lodge Trust was 23 January 2019, this being the date that the trustees of Lingfield Lodge Trust instructed their investment advisers to make the transfer, even though the transfer process then took several months to complete.

The allocation and apportionment of costs is based on estimates of how much staff time is spent on each type of activity and how much of the Swan Mead property is utilised for each activity, by time and area. In the trustees' judgement, no other material estimates have been used in the preparation of the financial statements.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Grants received to cover services provided during a particular time period are recognised in the financial statements for that period. Other grant income is recognised when received.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Raising funds

Raising funds includes all expenditure incurred by the charity to raise funds for its charitable purposes and includes costs of all fundraising activities, events and non-charitable trading.

Charitable activities

Resources expended on charitable activities have been analysed between:

- the costs of operating the Swan Mead centre, which is used to provide activity centre services during weekdays;
- the costs of operating the Short Breaks for Carers service;
- the costs of providing the Help at Home service;
- the costs of providing the Community Outreach service; and
- the cost of organising holidays and outings for members

As well as directly attributable costs, the cost of charitable activities includes a proportion of support staff and other costs.

Governance costs

Governance costs are those related to the management of the charity. As well as directly attributable costs, they include a proportion of support staff & other costs deemed to be a fair reflection of the time expended on governance matters.

Allocation and apportionment of costs

Staff costs have been allocated between the various charitable and other activities based on their duties. Where the duties of an individual member of staff cover a number of activities, their costs have been allocated based on the time they spend on each activity. Other costs that relate to more than one activity have also been apportioned between charitable and other activities.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its estimated useful life.

Plant and machinery

- 20% on cost

Small assets costing less than £500 are not capitalised, being written off through the current year's SOFA instead.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Hire purchase and leasing commitments

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The charitable company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the charitable company's pension scheme are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they relate.

Financial instruments

A financial instrument is a contract that gives rise to a financial asset of one entity and a financial liability or equity instrument of another entity.

The following financial instruments are recognised in the charity's balance sheet, using the policies as described below:

- 1. Bank current & deposit accounts and cash are initially recognised and subsequently measured at face value.
- 2. **Trade debtors and trade creditors** represent amounts due from / due to UK businesses, institutions and individuals and are all receivable / payable within one year. They are initially recognised at the transaction value, and thereafter measured at transaction value less subsequent payments, and in the case of trade debtors less any provision for impairment th at may be required.
- 3. **Listed fixed asset investments** comprise shares and units in UK and overseas publicly traded shares and funds. They were initially recognised on their donation to the charity at market value, and subsequently measured at market value. Realised and unrealised gains on the investments are recognised in the SOFA.

Special Designated Fund

The trustees have designated funds to be available to cover redundancy and other costs that would be incurred in the event of the charity having to close down.

Lingfield Lodge Trust donation

The Trustees have designated this gift to paying the rent, insurance and service charges for the Glen Vue Centre over the 20 year lease period commencing 3 May 2019.

Day Services

Funding is received from West Sussex County Council and Mid Sussex District Council for provision of an activity centre for older people. The actual costs of the service are more than the grant, so the deficit is funded from general funds.

Dementia Support

Funding is received from West Sussex County Council for the Short Breaks for Carers service. The actual costs of the service are more than the grant, so the deficit is funded from general funds.

Trips, Outings & Holidays

Grants have been received from a number of organisations in order to fund staff and other costs for carers relating to the provision of trips, outings and holidays for older people and those with disabilities.

Outreach

Grants have been received from a number of organisations in order to fund staff and other costs relating to the provision of the Community Outreach service. Allowing us to reach and contact older people in the more isolated areas of our district.

20. RELATED PARTY DISCLOSURES

There were no related party transactions for the year ended 31 March 2019.

21. POST BALANCE SHEET EVENTS

On 28 August 2019 the decision was made to terminate the Help at Home activity. This will be fully implemented by 31 October 2019. The expected financial effects of this decision are:

- Reduction in the charity's future annual income of approximately £67,000 per annum, from November 2019
- Reduction in the charity's future annual expenditure of approximately £76,000 per annum, from November 2019
- There will be redundancies, but as yet no estimate of the redundancy costs has been made.
