Age UK Stockport Update

February saw rates of coronavirus in Stockport continuing to fall gradually, although still higher than the national average at 178.6 per 100,000. There was good news with the continuing success of the vaccination programme, and in Stockport more than 80,000 people had been vaccinated by mid-February.

8th March will bring the start of the Governments Covid-19 Response Spring plan; a Roadmap out of the current lockdown that starts with the return of schools – although little else will change until the 29th March. Age UK Stockport will be following the Road Map and recovering and returning services at the rate permitted.

We don't intend to just return to the pre Covid normal—we plan to take all the many things we have learnt from the last 12 months to see how we can do things better than ever. Some obvious ones are the increasing importance of finding ways that everyone can benefit from some digital activity, and the new awareness around hygiene and infection control which we will be keeping up with.

Concessionary Passes



From the 1st February last year if you wanted to continue to use your concessionary pass to travel off peak on trams and trains in Greater Manchester you needed to pay an annual £10 fee; these are now starting to expire, but plans are in place to encourage people **not to travel to renew their pass**.

Instead, anyone who bought the £10 add-on in early 2020 and who needs to travel for a legally permitted reason will still be able to use their pass, without renewing, until **31 March 2021**.

TfGM is continuing to encourage people to stay at home to help protect the NHS and save lives. So the move is to minimise unnecessary trips on public transport to TfGM Travel-shops or Pay Point stores during lockdown.

Passholders that haven't previously paid, but do need to make essential journeys, will still need to pay £10 to add tram and train.

Do You Know March 21st is Census Day!



Households across Stockport will soon be asked to take part in Census 2021.

The census is a once-in-a-decade survey that gives us the most accurate estimate of all the people and households in England and Wales. It has been carried out every decade since 1801, with the exception of 1941.

It will be the first run predominantly **online**, with households receiving a letter with a unique access code, allowing them to complete the questionnaire on their computers, phones or tablets. But note below.

"A successful census will ensure everyone from local government to charities can put services and funding in the places where they are most needed," lain Bell, deputy national statistician at the Office for National Statistics, said.

"This could mean things like doctors' surgeries, schools and new transport routes. That's why it is so important everyone takes part and we have made it easier for people to do so online on any device, with help and paper questionnaires for those that need them."

Census day will be on March 21, but households across the country will receive letters with online codes allowing them to take part from early March.

The census will include questions about your sex, age, work, health, education, household size and ethnicity. And, for the first time, there will be a question asking people whether they have served in the armed forces, as well as voluntary questions for those aged 16 and over on sexual orientation and gender identity.

Results will be available within 12 months, although personal records will be locked away for 100 years, kept safe for future generations.

Stockport Storytellers



Stockport Storytellers started as a Culture Champions project in the first quarter to 2020 called 'Memories of Stockport'. People aged 50+ were invited to get together at Stockport Library to write stories about their memories of their earlier years in Stockport. Each author was then videoed narrating their stories and this was combined with images from the times and places to make a film.

It was hoped this would be taken around Care Homes and Community Centres and be shared to stimulate and encourage conversation, and also generate further interest in Creative Writing; perhaps culminating in an anthology of stories. COVID 19 prevented that but the group kept going and evolved into Stockport Storytellers.

Stockport Storytellers write a fiction short story every week on different subjects and themes, then meet on Skype every Thursday to give a friendly constructive critique of each other's stories and discuss them. They describe themselves as a 'friendly bunch, who support and encourage each other'.

They have a website: <u>http://www.stockportstorytellers.keepingustogether.org.uk/</u> where they showcase their stories. The film, Memories of Stockport is also on there and they are also adding their latest stories regularly, some of which are videoed.

The group always welcome new members from the over-50's, living in the Borough of Stockport. The only other criteria being a love of writing and the commitment to attempt a short story every week.

£75m of Unclaimed Pension Credit in GM



It is estimated that 43,000 people across the Greater Manchester region could be eligible to benefit from £75 million unclaimed monies.

Pension Credit is a benefit for people over State Pension age. It tops up your income if you're struggling to make ends meet.

If you are entitled to Pension Credit it could also get you access to additional financial benefits including a free TV licence for over 75s, housing

benefit and council tax support, and money towards home insulation.

Mayoral and Local Elections 6th May 21

There are local and Mayoral elections happening on 6 May 2021, including elections that were postponed from May 2020.

The electoral commission has said polling stations will be safe places to vote in these elections, but if you can't or don't want to go to the polling station you can vote by post or by proxy. You need to register to do this.

The deadline to register to vote is midnight on Monday 19 April.

If you would like to vote by post, you need to complete a postal vote application form. You can download this form <u>here.</u> You then need to send your completed form to the electoral services team at your council. For Stockport residents you can contact your local electoral registration team, via online form at <u>https://www.stockport.gov.uk/</u> <u>contact-elections</u>

The deadline to apply for a postal vote is 5pm on Tuesday 20 April.

When you're ready to return your postal vote, take it to the post box yourself or ask someone you know and trust to post it for you, or you can contact your local authority to ask if they can collect it from you.

Your postal vote needs to be with your local authority by 10pm on polling day, 6 May 2021 to be counted.

If you can't post your postal vote back in time, you can take it your polling station or to your local authority on polling day.



Energy Top Up Scam

Electricity users are being warned about a doorstep scam where victims are offered discounted credit for their top-up electricity meters. Victims have paid for discounted electricity top-ups, but later found the money did not reach their energy suppliers and had to pay for the electricity again.

Energy companies have launched a national campaign urging people to 'Top up Safe' by only buying electricity prepayment through official channels and not to buy credit for their meters on the doorstep.
