What makes Sheffield Age Friendly?

We're on the lookout for people and organisations that are making Sheffield a great place in which to age. Can you help us find them?

When Birmingham hit the national headlines for their talking bench last year, Sheffielders scratched their heads and wondered why. The Midlands city was being held up as a model of ageing well due to their talking bench but people from these parts pointed out a similar seat had been in the Winter Garden in 2017.

It set us wondering about what we have in our city that makes Sheffield a great place in which to grow older, and how we should celebrate them. Over the past few months, older people have been telling us that Supertram really helps to provide accessible transport into the city centre; and it is well known that one-third of Sheffield lies in the Peak District, and there are plenty of other open spaces in the city.



Now we're looking to uncover some less well-known contributors to developing an age friendly city – namely the people and organisations based here. And we're looking to you to help us find them.

Age Friendly Communities

We'd like to know what it is about your community

which makes it a great place for older people to live. Is it the library which provides a focal point for activity? A community centre which allows older people to use a public toilet when they need to? Or your friendly local shopkeeper who goes out of his or her way to make it easier for someone with limited mobility to do their shopping?

Age Friendly Businesses

Which businesses in our city really go the extra mile to provide a great customer experience for older people? Which have accessible premises, with space for mobility scooters? Which have the most helpful staff? And, if they display a "dementia friendly" sticker, are they really dementia friendly all the time?



Alternatively, an Age Friendly Business could be one that is a good employer of older people. They may have flexible working arrangements, reduced hours, or support for caring needs, to enable older people to carry on working into old age.

Age Friendly Champions

Do you know an older person who is still making a massive contribution to their community? Is one of your neighbours the lifeblood of the area, using their knowledge and warm heart to make things better for other local people?

Or do you know a younger person who gives their time and commitment to making your area a better place in which to grow old?

We want to hear about all these personal stories which demonstrate the human touch in making Sheffield a great city in which to grow older.


Documentary festival

The 26.2 mile run, which started and finished in Hillsborough and ran for several years in the 1980s and 1990s. will be staged again on June 8th, starting at 10am. Our plans to develop The Old Coach House in Hillsborough Park

Age UK Sheffield has been successful in a Stage 1 bid to the Heritage Lottery Fund, to redevelop The Old Coach House to become an older people's centre and community café.

We are intending to submit a planning application to Sheffield City Council in May 2019 and are now seeking people's views to inform this planning application.

We are also carrying out a survey to inform the development of our café proposals. **Please give us your feedback by Friday 26 April by:**
