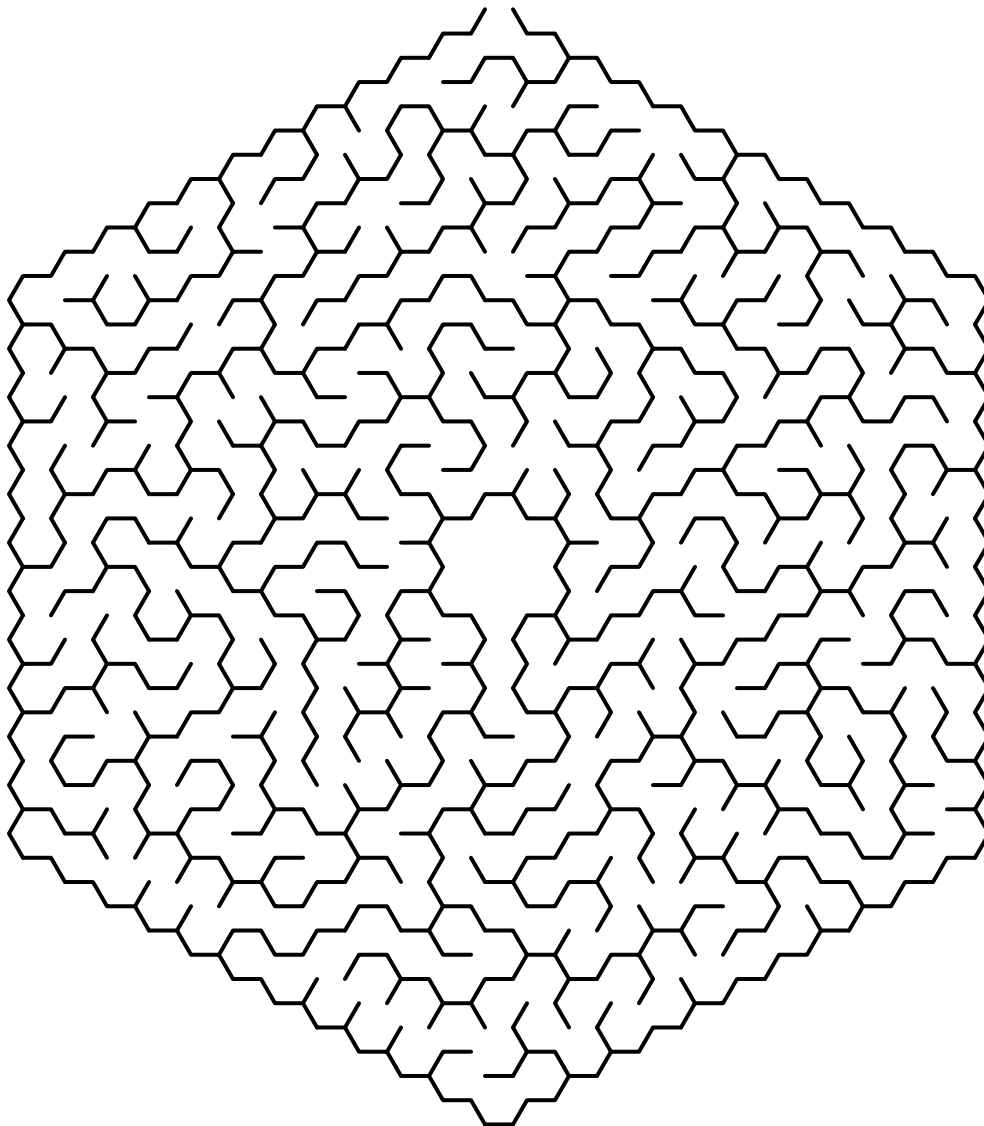

Unpleasing to a married ear!

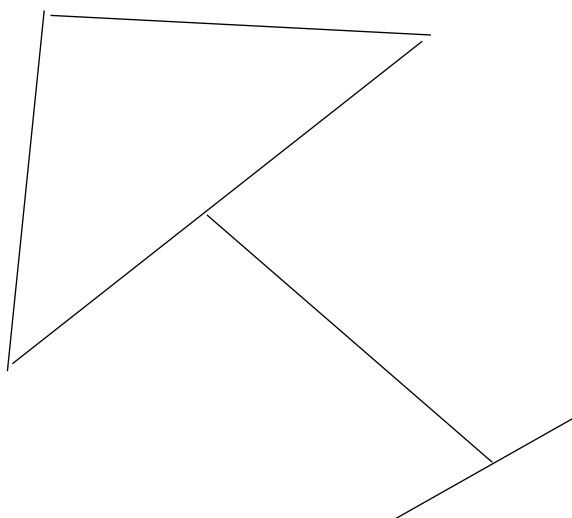
When shepherds pipe on oaten straws,

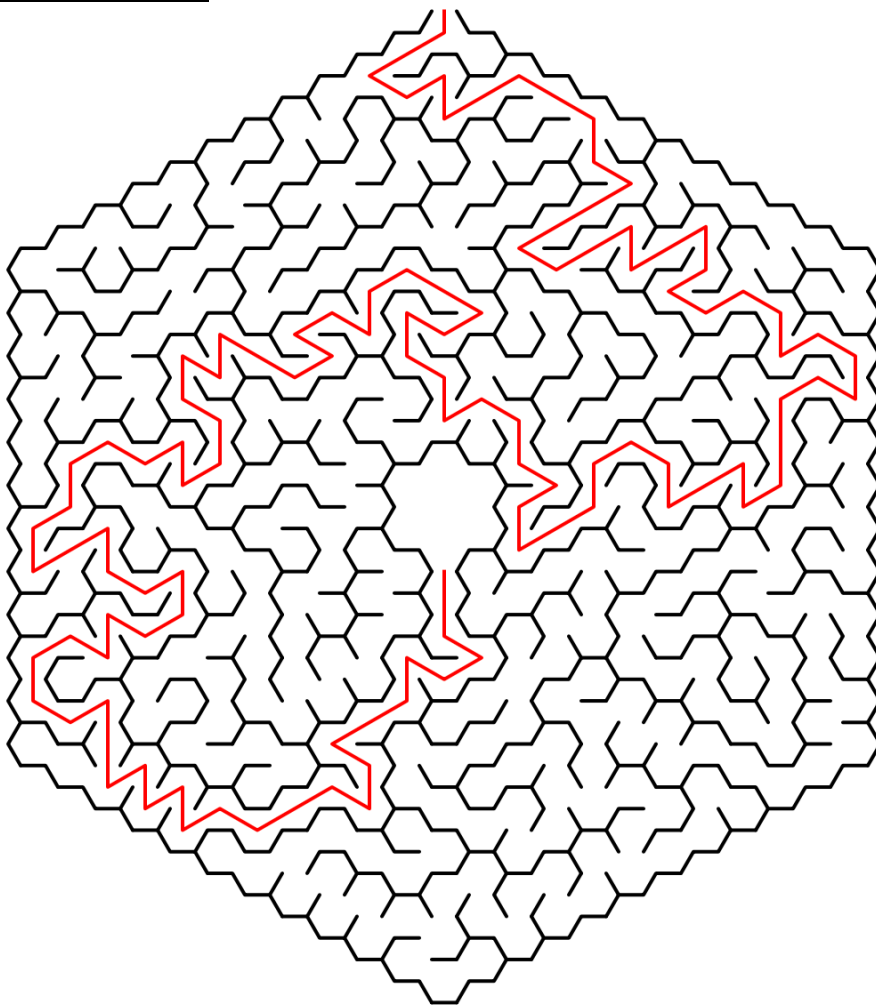
