Are you a confident social media user who can help us to deliver online activities?

You will be enthusiastic, self-motivated and able to develop a programme of online activities to improve the health and wellbeing of isolated LGBT+ people and promote their connectedness to others.

- recruit sessional workers
- market and administer activities
- liaise with digital providers
- build welcoming online communities
- ensure the successful delivery of the programme

You will have an understanding of

- the needs and experiences of older LGBT+ communities
- the needs of LGBT+ people who are restricted to their homes

You will also be a confident social media user who can identify appropriate online sites for content delivery, publicity, enrolment and audience participation with a good working knowledge of a range of online platforms.

This is an on-line role to be undertaken using your computer and phone from home. Hours are flexible in line with the needs of the programme which extends over a three-month period from January to March 2021.
