

Bath Central Walk Programme April – June 2019

All of these walks take 1-1.5 hours (approx.) and start from Bath Bus Station (railway end).

Assemble at 10.20am for a prompt 10.30am start.

Please note: Wear good shoes and appropriate clothing for the weather. Trousers will protect your legs against nettles and ticks. If we get very adverse weather, we shall always try to have a walk but the exact walk planned may have to be altered appropriately. In the event of extreme weather please ring the office to check if the walk is still taking place (01225 466135).

APRIL 5TH RADSTOCK to HAYDON and BACK.

Catch the bus to Radstock no 172, as far as the Westfield Trading estate. Walk down until we reach the footpath over the "batch". This is reclaimed land from the mine workings. The field is covered with stones containing fossils. There is a small uphill section on the way up to Haydon. We reach Maggs' house for refreshments etc. Follow the wide road back down to Radstock.

APRIL 12TH - Grosvenor Bridge to Batheaston via railway crossing towards Bathford.

We take the bus to the London Road and cross over to Grosvenor Bridge, then along the canal path to Bathhampton. We keep going to the rail crossing at the end of Tyning Rd and cross the field towards Bathford. We take the underpass to Batheaston and back on to the London Rd (East), where walkers can take the bus or carry on to the café for refreshments etc. It will be muddy if it's been raining, so very important to wear stout footwear.

April 19TH – Sydney Gardens to Pulteney Bridge.

Walking from the bus station along river and canal to Sydney Gardens, [refreshments at Holbourne Museum if preferred] before walk through Henrietta Park back to Pulteney Bridge. Flat walk, canal path might be muddy if there has been rain.

APRIL 26TH. MIDFORD and THE TWO TUNNELS.

Today we take the 1030hrs D3 bus to Midford from where start our walk back into Bath via the two Combe Down tunnels. The walk is completely flat but watch the footwear and clothing, it is not yet summer. Do feel free to bring a torch.

MAY 24TH. A WALK to THE SKYLINE VIEW.

No bus today as we walk from the bus station via Pulteney Bridge, Pulteney Street, Sydney Gardens, The Kennet and Avon Canal to a viewing point over the city. Glorious views if the sun is out. The walk follows a National Trust suggested route, so there is a free map today, but there is a short hill climb on today's walk.

Take bus no. 13 or 267 to the Cross Keys at Southstoke Lane. Walk to Southstoke village and then to the Millennium Viewpoint (lovely views) then return from Odd Down via Wansdyke. Fairly easy walk with some gentle uphill. Refreshments available from the Cross Keys.

JUNE 21ST. LANSDOWN to KELSTON VILLAGE.

From Bath racecourse (1030 hrs 620 bus) we will walk across the top of Lansdown and then down into the valley beyond and into Kelston village. All flat or downhill today but do watch the footwear, as there is field walking, although the views of Wales could be spectacular.
