


Learning from our Community

Ageing in a Pandemic



We wanted to give people over 50 years old in Bath and North East Somerset the chance to tell us what life has been like during a Pandemic.

We wanted to understand the challenges that prevent people ageing well and help identify what needs to change.

We asked questions about many areas of life including health & wellbeing, housing, ageism & the priorities for the area.



Background

We delivered 2000 surveys and received a 36% response rate from people right across Bath & North East Somerset

Impact of Covid-19

• 33% of people commented that they wanted easier

- Over half of respondents (52%) felt their health had declined with the majority of these people being over 75.
- The majority of people felt they had a comfortable home and food (91%) and were safe (83%).
- 42% of people say there is more community spirit now.
- Nearly half of people (48%) said they would like to feel less lonely.
- 28% of respondents felt they would like more practical support with help online and help in the home.



Impact of Covid-19

"My husband died (not covid) and now I'm alone in our home and feel isolated and my distractions are limited. I had to care for him almost single handedly, including medical procedures and I've felt much less supported than I may have been otherwise."

Practical & Physical Access


36% of respondents commented about practical and physical access






"The state of the pavements are a disgrace making walking extremely difficult. I suffered a nasty fall which needed hospital treatment." "....contractors

- Lack of buses in rural areas
- Unsafe pavements
- Lack of disabled parking
- Lack of public toilets
- Lack of accessible parking



"....contractors use the disabled parking space for their skipstoilets-storage, so when you go to park it's gone!"



"Life is a lot tougher when you're older. It feels like we are forgotten, no one gives a damn."

Practical Wellbeing

Many respondents made comments about lack of practical wellbeing support being something that they found difficult about living in Bath & North East Somerset.









Increased Community Police Presence At the moment, at the age of 66 I feel that i'm not being ignored. I realise as I age, that will happen to me. People will not be interested in my opinion! That will be hard for me."



Perceptions

The way in which older people are perceived within the area was mentioned in a number of responses.

Themes that came up regularly included:

- Feeling unappreciated in society
- Forgotten & ignored
- The feeling of discrimination as people felt the county is more focussed on students & families.
- B&NES being too Bath Centric.





"The other thing I want to say is my contact with my husband has got better, I have got to know him. He is marvelous at looking after me - I have a form of Parkinson's."

Positive Experiences

Encouragingly, **31%** of people made comments to suggest they were happy and positive with most aspects of Bath & North East Somerset.
