Age UK Bolton joins the nation in mourning The Queen

On September 8th 2022, a mammoth era in British and World history came to a close with the sad death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. Ascending to the throne following the death of her father, King George VI, on February 6th 1952, her reign of 70 years and 214 days makes her the longest reigning monarch in British history and the longest serving female as Head of State of all time. Age UK Bolton joined the nation in mourning, observing the nationally declared Bank Holiday on the day of the Queen's State Funeral



celebrations. During her reign, The Queen visited Bolton on numerous occasions, including a trip where, alongside The Duke of Edinburgh, Her Majesty officially opened Bolton Market Place and the "The Water Place" in 1988 as part of the town's 150th birthday.

Double Olympian visits Age UK Bolton

Former European Champion, World Cup Medallist and double Olympian Charlotte Gilmartin got her skates on to get down to the Age UK Bolton Ageing Well Centre in Farnworth to talk about safeguarding in sport, a topic that the short track speed skater-turned-firefighter is very passionate about.



The visit and talk was part of a health and wellbeing event organised by Age UK Bolton and included a talk about bio-mechanics from Age UK Bolton Strength and Balance Coach Stephen Franklin and involvement from Bolton Council's "Lets Keep Bolton Moving" campaign as well as representation from the Social Prescribing team.

Recently we all experienced the sad passing of Her Majesty The Queen. The end of an era, or more, the end of an epoch. Queen Elizabeth II has been for the vast majority of us, the only monarch we have ever known and a constant in our lives as the head of state. The global outpouring of love, affection and tribute towards her shows the profound impact she had.

As with many losses, even when they are expected as a result of advanced years and failing health, the news of the actual passing often comes as a shock.
