Items on the pavement



Advertising boards

Shops, cafes and pubs are allowed one freestanding board (a-boards) each, and they must ensure they leave at least 1.8 metres of clear pavement for you to get past. If these rules aren't being followed, contact: traffic@bristol.gov.uk or \$\cup\$ 0117 922 3209

Trees and shrubs

If a tree has fallen, or there are overhanging branches causing a hazard, report it at tinyurl.com/bdhuk9pv or 0117 922 2100

Scaffolding, skips and building materials
These need a permit if on the highway. If
they cause a hazard to pedestrians and
mobility aid users, report it at

Pavement parking



Parking on the pavement isn't illegal, but it is discouraged by the Highway Code. If a car is parked so that wheelchair users could not use the pavement, or emergency vehicles could not get through the road, report it at tinyurl.com/d87ar75f or \$\cup\$ 0117 922 2100

Report something that's broken

Damaged or unsafe pavement surfaces

Cracks, potholes, damaged drains or manhole covers

These will be repaired when spotted by the council, but you can help speed this up by reporting it. Please make a note of a house number, shop or pub/café so it can be located.

Signs and lamp posts

If a street light or road sign is flickering, not on at night or still on in the day, please report it at fixmystreet.bristol.gov.uk

The website will show you a map with all of the street lights so you can select the one that is broken

You can also report it by phoning the numbers above

You only need to do this once - it will be fixed within 20 working days, unless it is a cable fault which could take 6 weeks
