Bulky items

You can pay the council to remove large items - they may also be able to arrange for someone to collect furniture or appliances that can be mended and reused.

Sorting your recycling and rubbish

What goes where?



Black box

White and coloured paper, magazines, glass In a separate untied bag: textiles, shoes, batteries, spectacles, small electrical items



Green box

Cans, hard plastic (not black), jar lids, aerosols (lids removed), foil

Rinse all containers and flatten if possible



Blue bag

Cardboard boxes/tubes, cartons, greetings cards (no glitter), brown paper

Make sure boxes are flat and the lid is closed



Brown bin

All leftover cooked and uncooked food: vegetable scraps and peelings, meat and fish bones, tea bags, coffee grounds

Line the bin with newspaper or a compostable liner

Non-recyclable items should go in your black wheelie bin. Car batteries and engine oil can be put next to your black box. Paint and other hazardous items need to go to the household waste recycling centre (tip). You can book a visit to the recycling centre at recyclingcentrebooking.bristol.gov.uk

Collection Days

How often?

Every week

- Black and green recycling bins
 - Blue bags for cardboard
 - Brown food waste bins

Every two weeks

- Black wheelie bins
- Garden waste bins



When?

To get a copy of the recycling calendar for your neighbourhood, you can:

Search for your postcode and download one at bristol.gov.uk/bins-recycling

Call Bristol City Council on **0117 922 2100** if you want a copy sent to you in the post

Bins and recycling boxes should be put out **after 6pm** the day before collection and put back promptly after collection

Missed collections

If your recycling wasn't collected on the day shown on your calendar, you can report it at

bristol.gov.uk/bins-recycling or \ 0117 922 2100

You can report it from 5pm the day of the missed collection to 5pm the following day
