Job Title: Handyperson

Hours: 22.5 per week

Salary: £16,205

Location: Bromley – This role does not suit hybrid working

Reporting To: Handyperson Coordinator

Job Purpose: This is a rapid response role supporting older adults and those with long-term health conditions as they return home from hospital. The aim is to ensure that their home environment is safe, accessible, and hazard-free, enabling independent living. The Handyperson will carry out practical tasks such as fitting grab rails and making minor adaptations to reduce the risk of slips, trips and falls, as well as other light household jobs that promote safety and independence.

Key Responsibilities:

- Respond promptly to referrals, aiming for same-day service where needed, and liaise with health professionals to prioritise individuals who will benefit most from the service
- Carry out minor home adaptations to improve safety and independence including the fitting of grab rails, key safes, chair raisers, door chains, draught proofing, and smoke alarms
- Complete light maintenance and practical tasks such as assembling flat-pack furniture, hanging curtains, replacing tap washers, bleeding radiators, changing lightbulbs, and minor plumbing or electrical jobs
- Follow directions from Occupational Therapists for specialist or custom installations (note: gardening, painting and decorating are not included in this role)

- Maintain stock levels of equipment, keep inventory records, and ensure van and tools are roadworthy and safe to use
- Keep clear, confidential records of all visits and client information, in line with GDPR and organisational policies
- Handle payments securely for any paid services, following Age UK B&G's money handling procedures
- Always leave the client's home clean and tidy after completing work
- Wear an ID badge during visits and comply with health and safety, safeguarding, and professional conduct policies
- Support the wider organisation by working flexibly, reporting client concerns or compliments, and upholding the dignity and respect of all service users

This job description is intended as a summary of the main elements of the job described. They may be varied from time to time in consultation with the job holder without changing the general character of the duties or the level of responsibility entailed.

Person Specification:

- Maintain accurate records of all financial transactions connected to the purchase of tools and materials and monies collected for any paid for services
- Ability to read and interpret simple specifications, drawings and sketches outlining size, height and positioning of rails to be installed as directed by Age UK B&G OT and other health care professionals prior to or soon after a hospital discharge
- Use own initiative to identify and address any hazards that could cause trips or falls
- Practical hands on skills in secure fastenings, use of power tools, general maintenance, and hand rail installations
- To be aware of and comply with health & safety requirements including Moving & Lifting of loads, COSH, protective eye-ware
- Basic IT literacy
- Full UK Driving License

Desirable

- Awareness of equipment and minor adaptations available to help with independent living.
- Have an understanding of general health and disability conditions and how they impair a person's functional independence.
