Ask the Team - Developing our 'Values'



Support for Retail

- Volunteers Needed If you know anybody that might be able to spare a few hours a week to support our Charity Shops, then please encourage them to pop along to their nearest Age UK BRWF shop (our
 - Catshill and Rubery shops are particularly in need of some additional volunteer support). There are lots of different roles that people can get involved in from serving customers, sorting donations to creating window displays (which is something that CEO Amanda did recently for our High Street store)
- Following the introduction of the new EPOS Tills and epr system, our Retail Team are looking to increase the number of donations to our shops that are Gift Aided for every £1 we make from selling these items, Gift Aid gives us an extra 25p!
- To be able to Gift Aid donations, you need to be a UK Tax Payer and to have completed a Gift Aid declaration (which only takes a couple of minutes to do and is done online via a Tablet in the shop). You only need to sign up once, so any future donations that a person makes to any of our shops will be Gift Aided, so please can we ask for everyone's help to #SpreadTheGiftAidWord(s) as this will make a big difference to the money that we can raise to provide services in North Worcestershire!
