It is a partnership between Community Links and Age UK C&K which offers:

- Information and advice sessions around what dementia is (and isn't), financial issues, physical activity, healthy eating, housing and other services in Kirklees that can provided further help and support for people living with dementia and their carers.
 Referrals into our service must be made through the SWYPFT Memory Services or a GP and it is for adults of any age who have been diagnosed with dementia. These professionals can make referrals by calling the Hub co-ordinator on 07387 019180.
- 2. Our expert dementia advisor offers advice and information. They can help on any issues or concerns related to dementia. The helpline is open from Monday to Friday 9am-5pm.

Tackling Isolation in Calderdale

The Community Fund for Calderdale have commissioned a number of projects to tackle isolation in the borough. There are four organisation involved:

- The Ovenden Initiative are doing some micro-commissioning, signposting people to local Staying Well activities.
- Todmorden Health Centre will provide transport to their Health Champions activities including, art sessions, a walking group and more.
- Calderdale Community Transport will provide trips out to local community activities.
- Age UK Calderdale and Kirklees have three projects to be managed by Carly Munro, Community
 Projects and Volunteer Manager which will begin early 2018. All will have a part time worker and
 be supported by volunteers:

<u>Nearly Neighbours</u> - Following the success of the Ripponden project, we aim to create supportive networks for people to support those within the communities of Elland and Ovenden who are experiencing isolation and loneliness. We will increase awareness of issues facing older neighbours by working with existing groups, community champions and volunteers. The project will support and encourage people to be more neighbourly.



<u>Dementia Coordinator</u> - To compliment our existing befriending service, we aim to set up a specialist dementia project. The coordinator will recruit and train specialist volunteers to support people living with dementia, encourage the use of our dementia tool kit and signpost to other support organisations.

<u>Travel Companions</u> - to support older people to navigate transport issues of all varieties including helping with route planning and any other travel related queries and building link with local providers and encouraging them to become dementia and age friendly.

Jo Cox Commission on Loneliness - Final report



WORKING TOGETHER TO TACKLE LONELINESS

Before her death, Jo Cox set up a cross party Commission on Loneliness because she did not want to live in a country where 1000's of people were lonely and unhappy. This was continued by Rachel Reeve (Lab) and Seema Kennedy (Con): the Commission worked to address the impact loneliness and focused on the positive action we can all take. With the message 'Start a Conversation', the Commission tried to get people talking at all levels - whether chatting to a neighbour, visiting an old friend, or just making time for people you meet.

The final report from the Commission was launched on Dec 15th and called for action on 3 main fronts:

- 1. National leadership in Government including a UK wide Loneliness Strategy with ministerial lead.
- 2. Measurable progress with robust data including a national indicator, measures of effectiveness and easy to understand messages.
- 3. Support for action at a local level including an 'innovation and spread fund' from Government, trusts, foundations and other funders.

What can you do?

It could be as simple as starting a conversation! Or volunteer in your community, maybe with Age UK C&K or you can pledge your support on the Jo Cox website.

Age UK C&K Will Making Month - April 2018

Age UK Calderdale and Kirklees are holding a Will Making Month in April 2018 with the help of local solicitors, to encourage more people to make their will.

Having a will is the best way to ensure that your wishes are carried out after your death but research shows that around two-thirds of people haven't got round to writing a will yet.

By writing a will you can ensure there is adequate financial provision for your family and your estate will be divided as you want. If you're not sure what goes into a will, you can download a <u>Will Planner</u> from our website.

If you die without a will (called 'intestate'), there are strict guidelines that must be followed and these may not accord with your wishes.

To make your will, all you have to do is contact a participating solicitor and make an appointment between 1st and 30th April 2018.

- Please say you are calling about Age UK Calderdale and Kirklees 'Make a Will' month.
- All we ask is that you make a suggested donation of £60 per person or £100 per couple.
- This offer is open to anyone aged 50+, covers straight forward wills and does not include home visits. More complicated wills may incur extra charges, so please check with the solicitor first.
