Tasks/responsibilities

- Planning a series of workshops that are self-contained but contribute to a final shared piece or final exhibition of work.
- Designing workshops that are accessible to individuals with a wide range of abilities.
- Delivering each workshop with the help and support of our staff.
- Responding and adapting to the environment in each workshop session with patience.
- Ensuring each participant is given stimulating creative activities to complete and is encouraged to achieve their potential.
- Working with trained staff to ensure that there is a risk assessment in place and each activity is considered and appropriate.

Sheet supporting Creative Volunteer Role

Although part of a national federation of partners, Age UK Cambridgeshire and Peterborough is an independent local charity working in the community to support older people, their families and carers in the Cambridgeshire and Peterborough area. We offer a variety of services:

- We provide rights based information which older people and their carers can use with confidence to make informed decisions and choices.
- We offer practical support to enable older people to remain independent in their own homes.
- We aim to reduce social isolation by bringing people together, providing opportunities to meet people and develop friendships.
- We campaign every year aiming to reduce loneliness and isolation and to promote activity to support aging well.

We want everyone to be able to love later life and seek a talented and compassionate volunteer to help bring some magic into the lives of the people we work with.

We are keen to hear from professional arts practitioners who would like to develop their practice and work with our specialist group, and we are also keen to hear from volunteers who have a passion for the arts and the confidence to run workshops. All volunteers will be given training and will have the full support of our staff throughout each session. We have no funding available for payment at this stage, however we are exploring funding opportunities for future development of this work. We would like to run:

- Sessions lasting between 1 hour to a maximum of 2 hours
