Bringing joy to older people's lives at Christmas

Generous donations ensure older people will get some joy this festive period

A kind-hearted local woman has gone above and beyond to bring some joy to older people this Christmas.

Jessica Finney has been collecting food and gifts to make up over 30 Christmas hampers for vulnerable and lonely adults in the community.

The generous donation to Age UK Cheshire East came after Jessica overheard an older man explaining Christmas was a particularly difficult time for him.

Jessica said: "My grandad has been quite poorly over the last year and I often visited him in hospital. There was an older gentleman lying in the bed opposite saying 'I have nothing to look forward to, Christmas is just another day where I'm by myself'. It made my heart break and I had to do something to bring Christmas cheer to people like him.

People have been so generous; you couldn't actually get in my mum's dining room as it was like a food bank! It's worthwhile knowing what a difference this will make and I'm sure I'll now do it each year. I think you

should always help the people around you where possible and having grown up in Cheshire East, I chose to work hard to help the people in my area."

The Christmas hampers have been a real treat for older people who may otherwise see no one over the Christmas period. 150,000 people aged 60+ in the North West feel lonelier at Christmas time, with those who are single, separated or widowed feeling it the most.



Stefanie Underhill, Fundraising and Campaign Manager at Age UK Cheshire East said "We are so grateful for Jessica's thoughtful donation in the run up to Christmas. Loneliness is a huge issue that affects people all year round, however we know that the festive season can be a particularly difficult time.

We don't believe loneliness should be an inevitable part of growing older and the hampers will help spread the Christmas cheer to older people in Cheshire East"

One man receiving the hamper said "I have been so lonely since my wife passed away. It means a lot that someone I don't know was thinking of how lonely people like me get at Christmas and made such a kind gesture. It has gone some way to restore my faith in human kind."

Thanks also go to Nicola Makepeace who also made a tremendously generous donation of 50 hampers for distribution to local older people.

New 'iace' service supports carers

Cheshire East Council funded project launched

iace is a new service commissioned by Cheshire East Council, which provides easy access to accurate, relevant information and advice which enables people to understand their options relating to; all aspects of care and support, health and disability conditions, resolving issues, making choices and accessing services.

The service is for anyone who has queries about adult social care issues including people with illnesses and disabilities, carers and young people in transition from children's to adult services.

Issues we can help with include:

- The Care Act
- Peer social support and leisure activities
- Accessing care and support services
- Paying for Personal Care
- Condition specific information
- Adaptive technologies and independent living aids

The iace service is provided by a consortium of local, quality assured,information and advice providers including; Citizens Advice Cheshire East (CACE), Age UK Cheshire East, Age UK Cheshire, Disability Information Bureau (DIB), Citizens Advice Cheshire North (CACN) and the Deafness Support Network.

Information & Advice Team helps prevent eviction

Quick action by our team keeps man at home this Christmas

Our charity has an Information and Advice Team which is currently funded by the Big Lottery. Their role is to provide clients with a wide range of free information and advice to address a whole host of issues which they may face in later life. Our staff and volunteers work closely with clients to try and get the best outcome possible, and often work with other agencies in achieving this. The brief case study below is a great example how we can achieve some life changing results for older people, working with agencies across the local area.

A client of Age UK Cheshire East recently contacted our Information and Advice team in connection with his imminent eviction from his home. Formal possession proceedings were underway and a court hearing arranged.

The client was extremely distressed and anxious about not only facing the loss of his home but also potential homelessness. The client had no family support and was struggling to accept and respond to the situation.



The client struggles to engage with 'formal' organisations due to a profound suspicion and lack of trust in those organisations. With the client's consent, Age UK

Cheshire East contacted a number of agencies to establish his housing position and have assisted in arranging legal representation.

Age UK Cheshire East was able to work with the client and their landlord to ensure that the landlord was able to comply with their duty to maintain the property. The possession proceedings have now been suspended and the threat of eviction lifted.
