Following its successful opening by local MP David Rutley back in September, our new service, based in Macclesfield, aimed at those with dementia and memory problems, is going from strength to strength.

Our service users have enjoyed visits from the resident Cockapoo 'Betsy' as well as decorating the rooms (and each other!) for Halloween.

"My wife loves attending so much she now goes for two days a week, the variety of experiences on offer makes this service excellent value for money" The service is open 5 days a week, staffed by paid support workers and team leaders, who are also supported by a number of volunteers, many who have worked with the service users for a number of years. As well as being provided with a hot lunch and a regular supply of tea and coffee, service users

have enjoyed several trips out, listening to songs from the Hullabaloo choir as well as music from singer Mary who entertained the group with music from the 60's. Service users added to the music by joining in playing a range of musical instruments. The Group has also been preparing for bonfire night with arts and crafts.

Wednesday lunch club launches in Poynton

Working in partnership with Poynton with Worth Town Council to provide new service in the town

A Wednesday group for older people who are physically frail and/or have some memory problems has started at Poynton Civic Hall.

The Group meets from 10.00am to 2.00pm and provides a caring and stimulating environment for up to ten people. Previously, day support has been delivered separately, one group supporting older people with memory problems and another supporting physically frail older people. The new service with combine these groups into one session with increased capacity and activities to suit all.



Transport can be arranged at a small additional cost.

Experienced and trained volunteers organise games and activities, singing and light exercise. A hot lunch is also provided.

This new initiative is managed by Poynton Town Council in partnership with Age UK Cheshire East and costs £20 per session.

Help at Home

Helping older people remain more independent in their homes

Age UK Cheshire East provides a Help at Home service, ensuring that older people can lead more independent lives and remain in their own homes longer. The Home Helps provide services such as cleaning, washing up, changing bedding, doing laundry and ironing, collecting prescriptions or shopping, preparing light lunches and other tasks around the home.

All our Home Helps are fully DBS checked and are carefully selected to ensure they are suitable and appropriate to work with older people. A recent satisfaction survey of the service showed a high level of satisfaction with the service provided.

Our Men in Sheds is moving

Changes planned to the Men in Sheds project in Macclesfield

Changes are afoot in the Macclesfield Men in Sheds project, with the current Shed, based in Crossall Street in the town, closing on 18 November this year, to enable the construction of a new shed nearby at the rear of our Newbridge House site in Henderson Street, only a few minutes walk from the current Shed.

The shed will be closed throughout December to allow it to be kitted out and readied for use, when the Shed reopens in the New Year.

Damon Taylor, Chief Executive of the charity said "Men in Sheds is a vitally important project to this charity as it works with men who are not always as easy to engage with in activities. We are pleased to be able to continue to provide this great project and are grateful to a number of parties, including the Royal British Legion and Morrisons for helping to fund the new Shed."

The new shed will be officially opened at a ceremony in the New Year.

Helping older people tackle difficult issues in later life

Our charity provides a wide range of support to older people in Cheshire East. Our Information and Advice team provides advice both within the office environment but also out in people's homes. As our charity provides a wide range of services, and work closely with other organisations, we are very quickly able to help people find an answer to some very difficult issues, like Mrs C recently found:

Mrs C is the sole carer for her husband, who has vascular dementia. She contacted Age UK Cheshire East as she needed timely assistance. Mrs C telephoned us to ask for help with completing a claim for Attendance Allowance. A member of staff from Information & Advice made contact shortly afterwards and arranged a visit.

During the visit, Mrs C described how her husband was no longer able to participate in the social activities he previously engaged in. Mr C is increasingly reliant on his wife for practical and emotional support. The Dementia Day Support Service was discussed, to offer the opportunity for social stimulation for Mr C, and enable his wife to have a break from the caring role.

The I & A worker liaised with the Dementia Day Support Service to arrange a 'taster' session. Mrs C reported that she was relieved her husband had enjoyed the experience and further sessions have now been booked.

New project begins

Age UK Cheshire East working in partnership with Peaks & Plains Housing Trust

One You Cheshire East is an exciting new project to be officially launched at the end of this month, which will see the Charity employ four Lifestyle Support workers who will support people across Cheshire East to improve their health, in the following areas:

Alcohol use; Smoking cessation; Physical Activity; Weight Management; Healthy Eating; Sexual Health

The workers will identify people eligible for services, supporting people to manage their health. They will also provide training and advice, referring people to specialist services where appropriate.

Lifelinks reaches out into the community

Over 7,000 local people already benefiting from project

Since the project was first established in July 2015, more than 7,330 people have received support from the Lifelinks team. The project, delivered in partnership with Peaks & Plains Housing Trust and funded by Cheshire East Council, aims to support people to self manage long term conditions and other issues including loneliness and social isolation, and provide greater access to community services and activities than enable people to maintain their health and wellbeing.

Our team of seven wellbeing co-ordinators go out into the community across Cheshire East, working closely with people who would benefit from the service. Since the start of the project, we have worked with clients on a

one-to-one basis and given advice and support specifically tailored to their needs. The team are able to help people get involved in local groups and activities in the community; learn to use computers, laptops and tablets to help them keep in touch with friends and family; prevent minor health conditions from becoming a major problem; and provided advice and information on home adaptations and equipment to help people live independently in their own home



Analysis of the Project's success at the end of its first year of operation shows that 70% of people we have worked with report a positive improvement in their mental wellbeing.
