Am I eligible?

You can sign up to Gift Aid your gift if you pay UK income tax.

Providing you pay as much tax (income and/or capital gains) as the gift aid due, the Charity will be entitled to reclaim tax on your gifts in the same financial year. For example, if you Gift Aid charitable gifts totalling £1,000, you will need to have paid at least £250 income tax.

For every £1 of your gift, we can make an extra 25p when you sign up for Gift Aid. Because we reclaim the tax from the government, it does not cost you a penny.

Are you a higher rate taxpayer looking to reclaim tax from your gift, all you have to do is remember to include details of your charitable gifts on your tax form. Also, from April 2003, higher rate taxpayers were able to reclaim tax relief from gifts paid to charity both during the previous tax year and during the current tax year, that means the relief is paid that much quicker.
