#### **Raising Awareness**

This simple idea raised awareness and revealed so much genuine support and emotion, here are just a few examples:

- · Whilst hand delivering flyers to promote the morning, Maria and Linda were stopped by a shopper who runs a support group in the far West, who commented on how much Macmillan funding has meant to them. They were also encouraged to see there was a visual presence and fundraising campaign for Macmillan during the pandemic
- · A person known to the team shared their personal experiences. and the navigators were able to offer continued support and guidance on the day, listening to how her experience had progressed
- · A staff member of a local business shared **how important Macmillan Nurses were at the end of life of a family member**
- · A local builder shared he had previously been homeless and how St Petrocs had supported him to get back on his feet. He thought
