Welcome to the December Edition of our newsletter!

As we reach the end of 2025, I want to take a moment to reflect on a year that has tested our resilience, sharpened our focus, and strengthened our commitment to older people across Dorset.

This winter arrives at a time of continued pressure for many in our community. Dorset has one of the oldest populations in the country, with nearly 30% of residents aged 65+. Many live on fixed incomes, face rural isolation, or live in homes that are difficult and expensive to heat. The recent Autumn Budget offers some welcome support, including the 4.8% increase to the State Pension and steps to simplify tax for digitally excluded older people, but also brings concern as frozen tax thresholds pull more older people into paying tax, and energy costs remain high for many of the people we support daily.

At Age UK North, South & West Dorset, our message remains clear: whatever national policy brings, we will be here. We will continue to offer free income and benefit checks, warm spaces, dementia support, social groups, home visits, and practical help to keep people safe, connected, and independent.

This year we have delivered more than 15,000 meaningful support interactions and helped secure over £1.4 million in confirmed annual benefit gains, ensuring older people in Dorset can afford essentials and maintain dignity and stability. Over the past three years, that impact totals nearly £5 million in income secured for local residents, money spent locally, sustaining households and strengthening communities.

We also received a very special message this autumn. Following the submission of our annual gratitude letter for his support of community organisations, Buckingham Palace replied:



"His Majesty The King is deeply moved by those who devote enormous amounts of their time and energy to helping people in their local community, and conveys his warmest good wishes to everyone at Age UK North, South and West Dorset."



This recognition belongs to every volunteer, every staff member, every partner, and every supporter who makes our work possible. Thank you.

This month we also held our AGM, where we marked both endings and new beginnings. My heartfelt thanks go to Simon Clifford, our outgoing Chair, whose steady leadership helped guide the charity through challenging and transformative times. Simon brought candour, integrity, and unwavering commitment to our mission. The relationship between a CEO and Chair is crucial; it can shape the culture, direction, and resilience of a charity. I am grateful for the support, challenge, and trust Simon has offered during a period of significant change.

We now welcome our new Chair, Matt Smith, Chief Officer at Weldmar Hospice. Matt brings deep experience in health, community services, and nonprofit leadership. His insight, compassion, and strategic drive will be invaluable as we continue our journey of strengthening financial sustainability, growing our services, and ensuring the voices of older people remain firmly at the heart of everything we do. As we look forward to 2026, we do so with optimism, clarity, and determination.

We are turning the tide. We are building foundations for long-term stability. And we are doing it while remaining true to who we are: a charity rooted in kindness, expertise, and unwavering commitment to older people across Dorset.

Thank you, to our staff, volunteers, trustees, partners, supporters, and the community we serve. None of this is possible without you.

Information Event

Age UK NSWD had an information stall at the Carers Rights Day Health & Wellbeing Fair held at Wellworthy Social Club in Weymouth on the 20th November.

The event was extremely well attended and our Independent Living Co-ordinator, Hilary (pictured right), gave out lots of information leaflets and booklets.

Hilary came away with a long list of follow up work from having a host of conversations with older carers who are coping with a variety of situations in order to care for their loved ones.



WOW - Well Done Ellie



One of our Welfare Benefits Managers Ellie (pictured left) attended a community meeting at the Sturminster Colton Care home. Ellie received a referral for a 97 year old lady in the community who wanted us to look into benefits for her.

On speaking to the lady it was clear she would be eligible for Attendance Allowance (higher rate); Ellie arranged a visit and went to meet the lady to complete the AA form. Whilst she was reluctant to claim means tested benefits, Ellie gave her some rough figures as to minimum weekly amounts the government believe each person should be on and the lady laughed.

The lady has been living on £97 a week for the past 30 years (the current government minimum is £227.10). Ellie applied for AA, this will be topped up to £310 a week (due to her new Severe Disability premium of an additional minimum of £82.90 extra). In all, Ellie's visit to this lady will gain her an extra £16,816.80 a year...and that's before we even add on her full Council tax reduction!

Musical Fun

We run engaging brain training sessions across Dorset, designed for people with mild cognitive impairment, early-stage dementia, or memory loss.

Each session includes activities such as reminiscence, quizzes, and games - focusing on opinions rather than facts, so there's no such thing as a wrong answer! Many participants tell us they experience improved confidence, communication skills, mood, and overall quality of life. Most importantly, they have fun and enjoy being part of the group!


