Staysafe Small Tasks Handyperson Scheme



Staysafe

Staysafe helps people to maintain their independence and feel safe and secure in their own home. Many accidents are preventable. Staysafe offers advice and practical help in reducing the risks of having accidents in the home, particularly falls.

Staysafe offers a number of services including the Small Tasks Handyperson Scheme and Fix-A-Home directory.

What is the Small Tasks Handyperson Scheme?

If you feel that you require help then the Handy person service can carry out a range of small, minor household repairs and maintenance, which you are no longer able to manage yourself.

The Scheme prioritises its work around the main causes of falls and accidents at home.

Examples of what the Small Tasks Handyperson can do:

- Change light bulbs
- Replace a fuse or plug
- Change curtains and rails
- Fit draft excluders
- Put up shelves and pictures
- Touch up painting
- Assemble new items

- Adjust doors to open and close easily
- Remove autumn leaves from pathways
- Fit hand rails
- Fit bolts and locks

Examples of what the Small Tasks Handyperson can't do:

- Work involving gas appliances
- Electrical work
- Work above step ladder height
- Tasks requiring specialist skills
- Complicated or dangerous tasks
- Moving heavy items
- Tasks taking more than 3 hours

Clients requiring a specialised job not covered by the Small Tasks Handyperson Scheme should ask for copy of the Fix-A-Home Directory or download a copy form our website www.ageukdudley.org.uk. Fix-A-Home is a Dudley Trading Standards approved Directory with details of contractors across a wide variety of different trades.

Who qualifies for the Scheme?

People aged 50 or over living in the Dudley Borough.

How do I get referred to the Scheme?

What happens if I qualify for the Scheme?

If you need a job doing by the Small Tasks Handyperson Scheme a home visit will be booked to assess the job. Once we are happy that the work can be completed under the scheme, your details will be passed to one of our volunteers who will contact you to book a convenient date.

All Volunteers are vetted and DBS checked and give their time and expertise to carry out the task for free.

Is there a charge?

This service operates on a chargeable basis at a rate of £25 per hour . Tasks that do not require a full hour to complete will be charged at half hourly increments of £12.50. For example, a small task that takes 25 minutes to complete will be charged at £12.50. A task that requires 45 minutes to complete will be charged at the full hourly rate of £25.
