

Volunteer Neighbourly Connector (Home Visiting)

This is a really important and highly valued role, which aims to provide companionship, and to help combat loneliness and social isolation among older and vulnerable members of our community.

What you might do as a volunteer Neighbourhood Connector:

- Visit an older person in their own home on a regular basis to -
- share a cup of tea and a chat
- Accompany someone to a GP/Hospital appointment
- Help someone to get out and about perhaps escorting them to do some shopping, go out for a coffee, visit a library, or take an exercise class
- Help an older person to become digitally connected by phone, tablet, computer or email
- Provide information and refer to other services

Personal qualities most suited to this role:

- Good interpersonal skills, particularly listening
- Understands confidentiality and is tactful, discreet and sensitive
- · Has a sense of humour and is engaging and motivating
- Able to be patient and understands and empathises with the needs of older people
- Reliable and able to deal with emergencies.

Training and support will be provided to all volunteers

How much time is involved?

2-4 hours per week between 10am and 5pm. Days and times are flexible as agreed with your supervisor. We hope you would be able to commit to at least 6 months.

Expenses and Insurance:

We will cover agreed out-of-pocket expenses for volunteers (e.g., travel costs). We will also insure you for the time you are volunteering with us. A DBS police check certificate will be required. We can help you obtain a free but compulsory DBS police Check.
