Enabling and Home Support

This service is designed to give older people a friendly, reliable service that can offer one to one support and improve quality of life.

All our Home Support Workers are paid members of staff.

They are mature, local people who are dependable, caring and sensitive to clients needs.

They are also trained in the safe use of wheelchairs.

We can help with all sorts of different things including:

- shopping
 - getting to and from appointments
 - paperwork, bills and correspondence
 - accompany clients on a social outing
 - housework
 - light gardening
 - cooking
 - stay fit
 - cleaning
 - laundry
 - ironing
 - bedmaking
 - having a break by sitting with the person you care for
 - clear clutter
- ...and lots more!

There are some things that Home Support Workers cannot help with:

- they cannot help with personal care
- they cannot perform medical tasks or help with medication
- they cannot take over the running of your home for you
- they cannot collect your pension or take your bank or pension card without you

Following a clients initial contact with us we will arrange to visit them at home, so that we can be sure we fully understand their needs and offer advice on other services and benefits available.

There is a charge for this assessment payable at time of booking an appointment. Should you take up the service, ongoing visits will be charged at an hourly rate.

A mileage charge of 55p per mile applies to all escorted journeys or journeys made on your behalf. Any additional expenses should be paid for by you at the time. Payment for the service is by Direct Debit on a monthly basis.
