

# knit a rainbow

## knitted bobble hat

This hat has got it all. Colours of the rainbow, that is. If you want to send any pots of gold you find to us directly, we're totally fine with that.

### abbreviations:

**st(s)** - stitch(es)

**st st** - stocking stitch

**k2tog** - knit two together

### how you knit it:

Cast on 31 sts in red.

Knit two rows (garter st).

Change to orange and beginning with a knit row continue in st as follows:

2 rows orange, 2 rows yellow,

2 rows green, 2 rows blue, 2 rows

purple, 2 rows pink.

Continue in pink.

**next row:** k2tog to last st, k1 (16sts).

**next row:** purl.

**next row:** k2tog to end (8sts).

4mm

Cut the yarn and pull through remaining stitches.

**making up:**

Use a sewing needle to join side seams.

Make a pompom using all the colours and sew it securely to top of the hat.

You can now sing (and knit) a rainbow.

**These patterns are just ideas to get you started. Feel free to try different colours, and come up with designs of your own. We love seeing your creations.**

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# Sir Hopsalot

## knitted rabbit hat

If you like hats with a bit of extra bounce, this is the one for you.

### abbreviations:

**st(s)** - stitch(es)

**st st** - stocking stitch

**garter stitch** – knit all rows

**k** - knit

**k2tog** - knit two together

### how you knit it:

Cast on 31 sts.

Start with a knit row knit 14 rows in st.

**next row:** k2tog to last st, k1 (16sts).

**next row:** purl.

**next row:** k2tog to end (8sts).

Cut the yarn pulling it through the remaining stitches and fasten off.

### ears: (make 2)

Cast on 7 sts and work 6 rows in garter stitch.

**next row:** k2, k3tog k2(5sts).

Knit another 7 rows in garter stitch.

**next row:** k1, k3tog k1(5sts).

Knit another 5 rows in garter stitch then knit all 3 sts together and pull yarn through the loop.

### **making up:**

Use a sewing needle to join side seams.

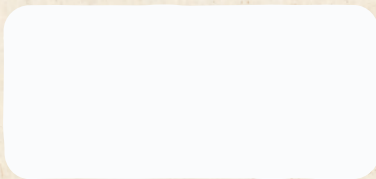
Sew end in at the tip of the ears and, pinching the bottom of the ears so they stand up, sew them to the hat.

Embroider eyes, nose and mouth in black, brown and pink yarn.

Give him a carrot and make sure Beatrix Potter doesn't get her hands on him.

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# cherry on top

## knitted cupcake hat

Want to go on Bake Off but haven't got the cake-making skills to back it up? Well, now's your chance to knit your sweet treats instead and save yourself the washing up.

### abbreviations:

**st(s):** stitch(es)

**st st:** stocking stitch

**k2tog:** knit two together

**m1:** make a stitch by picking up the loop between two stitches and knitting it

### how you knit it:

Cast on 30 stitches in brown.

**row 1:** (K1,P1) repeat to the end of the row.

**row 2:** (K1,P1) repeat to the end of the row.

These two rows form the rib.

Continue until you have worked 12 rows.

**row 13:** Change to pink. K1 (M1, K5),

repeat to last 4 sts, M1, K4 (36sts).

**rows 14 – 18:** Work in st st starting with a purl row.

**row 19:** (K4 K2tog) repeat to the end of the row (30st).

**row 20** and all alternate rows: Purl.

**row 21:** (K3, K2tog) repeat to the end of the row (24st).

**row 23:** (K2, K2tog) repeat to the end of the row (18st).

**row 25:** (K1, K2tog) repeat to the end of the row (12st).

**row 27:** (K2tog) across all stitches (6st).

Thread the yarn through the remaining stitches and pull tight.

### how to make the cherry:

Cast on 1 st.

K1, P1, K1, P1, K1 into this stitch.

Turn and P5 stitches.

Turn and K5 stitches.

Turn, P2tog, P1, P2tog.

Turn K3tog.

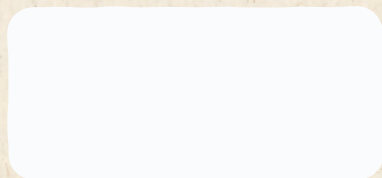
**row 30:** P3tog and fasten off.

### making up:

Sew your cake up and put a little padding in the top to make it look extra plump.

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# shake yo' PomPom

## crochet bobble hat

Call us old fashioned, but there's nothing quite like a classic bobble dazzler to get hooks looping.

### abbreviations: (UK)

**ch** – chain

**st(s)** – stitch(es)

**dc** – double crochet

**inc** – increase

### how you crochet it:

(in blue) Start 6 dc in a magic ring [6]

**round 1:** (in pink) inc in all 6 st [12]

**round 2:** (in blue) (dc in next st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

**round 3:** (in pink) (dc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [24]

**round 4:** (in blue) (dc in next 4 st, inc in next st) repeat 5 times [30]

**round 5 - 12:** (start in pink and alternate colours each round) dc in all 30 st [30]

3.5mm  
crochet hook

Fasten off and sew in end.

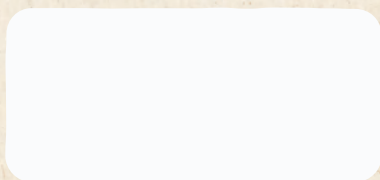
**making up:**

Make a large pompom with both colours either using a pompom maker or a fork. Sew it nice and securely to the top, in the centre, and trim if necessary.

Congratulations, you've made the hattiest hat of them all. We'll take one in human size.

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# fantastic fox hat

## crochet fox hat

You might have heard of the fox glove, but we bet you've never heard of its woollier, cosier cousin, the fox hat.

### abbreviations: (UK)

**ch** – chain

**st(s)** – stitch(es)

**dc** – double crochet

**inc** – increase

### how you crochet it:

Begin 6 dc in a magic ring. [6]

**round 1:** inc in all 6 st. [12]

**round 2:** (dc in next st, inc in next st)  
repeat 6 times. [18]

**round 3:** (dc in next 2 st, inc in  
next st) repeat 6 times. [24]

**round 4:** (dc in next 4 st, inc in next st)  
repeat 5 times. [30]

**round 5 - 16:** dc in all 30 st [30]

Fasten off and sew in end.

Fold up the rim (approx. last 4 rounds).

3.5mm

Add a few stitches on either side to keep in place.

### ears: (make 2)

**note:** I use the tapestry technique for the ears. If you are not confident using this technique, you can choose to crochet the ears in just orange wool, or crochet the cream part separate and embroider them on at the end.

(in orange) 4 dc in a magic ring. [4]

**round 1:** dc in all 4 sts. [4]

**round 2:** inc into next st, dc in all sts. [5]

**round 3:** inc into next st, dc into next st,

(in cream) 1 dc,

(in orange) 5 dc. [6]

**round 4:** inc into next st, dc into next st,

(in cream) 2 dc,

(in orange) 4 dc. [7]

**round 5:** dc into next st,

(in cream) 3 dc,

(in orange) 4 dc. [7]

**round 6:** dc into next st

(in cream) 4 dc,

(in orange) 3 dc. [7]

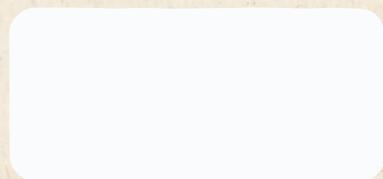
**round 6:** (in orange) dc into all sts. [7]

Fasten off and leave a long tail for sewing onto the head.

### making up:

Use a sewing needle, stitch both ears onto the top of the body.

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# really flashy bird

## crochet peacock hat

Frills, feathers, and plenty of hattitude.  
This one's a crowning glory.

### abbreviations: (UK)

**ch** – chain

**st(s)** – stitch(es)

**dc** – double crochet

**inc** – increase

**dec** – decrease

### how you crochet it:

Start by making the body.

Work 6 dc in a magic ring. [6]

**round 1:** inc in all 6 st. [12]

**round 2:** (dc in next st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times. [18]

**round 3:** (dc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times. [24]

**round 4:** (dc in next 4 st, inc in next st) repeat 5 times. [30]

**round 5 - 12:** dc in all 30 st [30]

Fasten off and sew in end.

3.5 & 2.5mm

### wings: (make 2)

Ch 6. Stitches are worked around both sides of the foundation chain.

**round 1:** start in second ch from hook, inc in this st, dc in next 3 st, inc in next st. Ch 1. Continue on other side of the foundation chain, dc in next 4 st, inc in next st. [12]

**round 2:** dc in all 12 st. [12]

Fasten off and sew one end of the wing onto the body between rows 6-9.

### legs: (make 2)

Start 6 dcs in a magic ring then ch 6 (to make the legs).

Sew onto second to last row of the body approx. 7 sts apart.

### head:

Start 6 dcs in a magic ring. [6]

**round 1:** inc in all 6 st. [12]

**round 2:** (dc in next st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times. [18]

**round 3-5:** dc in all 18 sts. [18]

**round 6:** (dc in next 3 st, dec) repeat 3 times. [12]

Start stuffing the head with fibrefill. (you will need to add more at round 8)

**round 7:** (dc in next 2 st, dec) repeat 2 times. [6]

**round 8:** dc in all 6 sts. [6]

Once nicely stuffed, fasten off, leaving a long tail, sew onto the top of the body.

### headpiece: (make 3)

Start 5 dcs in a magic ring then chain 5. Sew onto the centre of the head.

### beak:

Switch to a 2.5mm crochet hook.

Start 5 dcs in a magic ring. [5]

**round 1-5:** dc in all 5 sts. [5]

Sew onto the middle of the head approx. between rows 5-6.

### eyes: (make 2)

Using a 2.5mm hook, Start 5 dcs in a magic ring. [5]



Either insert a 4mm plastic safety eye into the centre or embroider one.  
Sew onto both sides of the head.

**plumage: (make 6)**

(in dark blue) Start 6 dcs in a magic ring. [6]

**round 1:** (in teal) inc in all 6 st. [12]

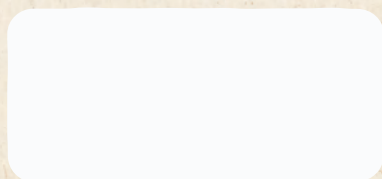
**round 2:** (in lime green) (dc in next st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times. [18]

Fasten off and stitch all 6 onto back of the body.

Sit back and watch him shake his tail feathers. Show off.

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
