Feature: Help at Home

Our Help at Home service provides regular visits to older people so they can remain living independently in their own homes.

Our Help at Home service provides assistance with tasks in and around the home, but often this help means much more than just a clean kitchen.

Following his wife's sudden death in September 2017, Ron was in shock and struggling to deal with bereavement; "I never really had a chance to say goodbye to my wife, I was just talking to her and then she just collapsed and that was it. I survived the first month or so.."

But coping with his loss combined with long standing health issues, meant Ron was unable to complete some day to day tasks. He was referred to our Help at Home service by a Health Visitor from his previous employer. This is where he met Ruth, one of our Help at Home Assistants.

Ruth has been visiting Ron for a little over a year. She visits four times a week and helps to run errands, prepare meals and keep the house clean and tidy. "She's done a marvellous job for me... without her I wouldn't be encouraged to do anything" says Ron.

When Ruth started visiting Ron a friendship began to blossom. Ruth and Ron share two things, a fascination with astronomy and a love of good conversation; "We're a good pair aren't we... like book ends!" says Ruth.

It is the conversation that has made a difference to Ron: "My principal need has been company. My relatives and friends are all far away and the thing for me was the shock and the nature of the situation I found myself in, the most important thing is to have human contact."

As well as helping with weekly tasks like shopping, ironing and cleaning, Ruth and Ron have undertaken

astronomy ventures, attended Ron's old work get-togethers and taken a trip to see Ruth's horses.

"I don't class it as work" says Ruth, "I keep saying to Ron sometimes I feel fraudulent. Even though I'm working we're just having a good time! It's more than being just a cleaner... It's a really rewarding job."

Person-centred dementia care across the two counties

Meeting Centres are a concept of dementia care created in the Netherlands. They provide a place where people are supported to understand and adapt to their diagnosis, offering person-centred support for people living with dementia and their carers and families.

This year the University of Worcester has been awarded funding from the Big Lottery for the Meeting Centre Support Programme - it is fantastic to work with them. We currently run centres in Droitwich and Hereford and are looking to roll these models out across the two counties. Meeting Centres make a huge difference to members and their families:

Worcestershire Association of Carers support the thousands of unpaid carers across the county.

Worcestershire Association of Carers (WAC) is a registered charity founded in 1997 providing an independent source of information, advice and support for unpaid adult carers in Worcestershire.

We understand the role of unpaid carers and the huge contribution they make to the community and work closely with partners like Age UK H&W so that we are engaging with vital members of the community.

We have worked with Age UK H&W on various projects, most recently with veterans, outreach, support, and training. In January this year Worcestershire Association of Carers reached out to Joining Forces, the Veteran's Wellcheck Service, at Age UK H&W to host a Carer Veterans awareness event.

General awareness of support for veterans (and their families) across the local carer population is low and Joining Forces were able to invite a range of other providers, such as Combat Stress and Veterans UK. We had over 40 carers attend the session.









Carers contact us for many reasons; for information, support and signposting or to join us for events, training and respite opportunities. We operate a helpline and can offer advice and support on various topics.

The helpline is available on 0300 012 4272 and is open 9am-7pm Mon-Fri and 9am – 12pm Saturdays.
