- Crime related matters that are a non-emergency via 101 or www.met.police.uk
- If you feel in danger or in an emergency always use 999

Staying safe at home and in your community

- Video doorbells (with housing provider permission)
- Use UV marking on any mobility scooters/valuable items
- Charity scams and “chugging”
- Fraudulent tradespeople
- Register blue badges online
- Prevent vehicle theft
- Look up, look out

Staying safe online

- **Phishing:** do not click on links within emails from unknown users
- **Limit personal information on apps**
- **Holiday/ticketing fraud**
- **If in any doubt about online banking, go to your bank in person. Your bank will not call you.**
