Keep warm this winter with Lancashire County Council



With the help of the Voluntary, Community, Faith and Social Enterprise (VCFSE) sector, Lancashire County Council is developing a network of warm spaces which residents can visit to keep warm, access information and advice or to simply spend time with others.

There are now more than 150 venues registered on their online directory, ranging from village halls to church centres and community cafes. Their registered spaces offer a variety of facilities and amenities, from free refreshments and craft activities to entertainment and access to digital equipment. To find your nearest warm space and what it can offer, visit Lancashire County Council's website (lancashire.gov.uk).

All of Lancashire's libraries can help with access to their website as well as support you with developing your digital skills, should you wish to. As registered warm spaces, our libraries are also providing free warm drinks, spaces to sit, free computers and internet access, charging points for digital equipment and a full range of events and activities. All our library staff are also well experienced in providing information, advice and signposting for any concerns you may have.

Each warm space has been asked to sign up to the Lancashire Warm Spaces Charter. The Charter was developed so that you are aware of what to always expect when you step into a registered warm space. The Charter revolves around seven core principles – a warm welcome, no judgement, respect and dignity, accessibility, safety, confidentiality and information.

Meet Bryan!

Bryan Moscrop, a veteran living in Lancashire, was united with his veteran's badge thanks to Age UK Lancashire's 'Removing Barriers' service.

'Removing Barriers' supports older veteran, their family members and carers to provide practical support over a 12-week period. This includes support at home, helping with access to social events and finding opportunities for them to be more active.

During the time spent with Bryan, he mentioned a Veteran's badge that he didn't receive after his service



and so our team were determined to get Bryan his deserved badge and did some research and were able to put an application in for the veteran's badge.

Shortly after the 12-week period, Bryan unfortunately ended up in hospital and on discharge he was then supported by Age UK Lancashire's Hospital After Service (HAS) team. On his arrival home, he found on his doorstep the badge that the Removing barriers team applied for.

Tracey Barclay-Smith, a HAS worker at Age UK Lancashire, saw the pride in Bryan's face when he finally received his badge and letter. To make sure it had its pride of place on the mantel piece, Tracey sourced a frame for his letter. Following that, Bryan received a regular carer who was a Veteran, and upon spotting his badge and letter they bonded over their experiences. Bryan was forever thankful to the Removing Barriers team and the impact this has had on his life.
