Throughout the Covid19 pandemic we have supported the most vulnerable local older people to stay informed, connected and independent




Total number of older people supported

We responded to 6,000 calls for help... for information, advice, vital services and to combat loneliness

Service delivery

We provided 29,896 hours and 28,433 visits to deliver essential shopping, cleaning and support





1089 older people supported in our centres with personal care, fun activities, companionship and a hot meal

Supported **5724** people following discharge from hospital to remain independent and safe at home and to prevent re-admission.





Provided support to **1100** people to help them manage their long term health conditions

Provided vital support to **218** older people with dementia and their carers, who have been particularly vulnerable due to Covid restrictions
