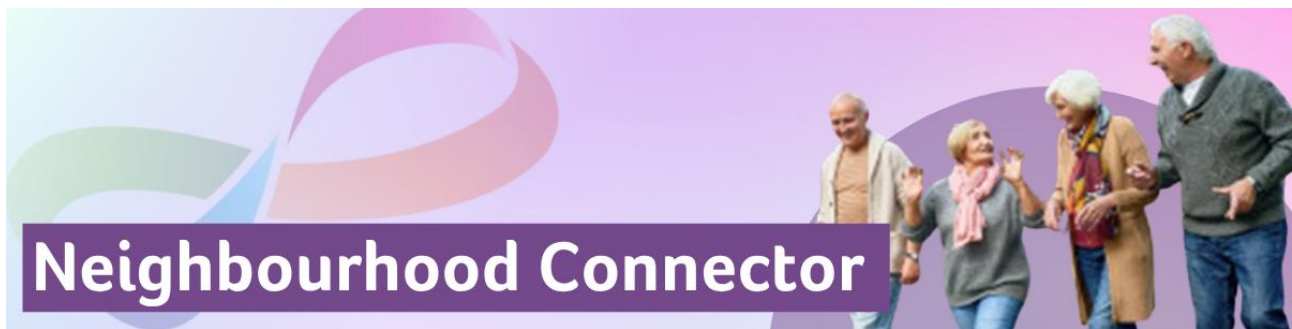




As a Neighbourhood Connector, you'll be helping to spread the word about our charity and the support we offer. You'll put up posters and share information in local venues, help promote our services within neighbourhoods, and chat with community members about what we do. You'll also keep us updated on what's happening locally, such as new groups, events, or opportunities, so we can better connect people to what's available. It's a hands-on, out-and-about role that makes a real difference by helping our charity stay visible and connected within the community.

What will I be doing?

- Putting up posters and sharing leaflets in local venues such as cafés, libraries, community centres, and noticeboards in your community.
- Removing out of date leaflets and posters
- Promoting the charity's services and activities within neighbourhoods
- Talking to community members to raise awareness of what the charity offers
- Keeping the charity updated on local events, groups, and opportunities that may benefit the people we support
- Helping strengthen connections between the charity and the wider community
- Acting as a visible representative of the charity while out and about

What skills and experience do I need?

- No specific experience is required, just enthusiasm and a desire to help connect people with what's happening locally in your area.
- A friendly, approachable manner and confidence talking to people in the community
- An interest in local community activities, groups, and events
