You can use the NHS app to:

- Search for, book and cancel appointments at your GP surgery and see details of your upcoming and past appointments
- ✓ View your health record
- ✓ Order repeat prescriptions
- ✓ Get health advice
- ✓ View your NHS number
- ✓ Get your NHS Covid pass

What do I need to create an account via NHS login?

- A smart phone
- An email address
- To be registered with a GP

App

Step 1: Download the app

Go to the App Store or Play Store, search for NHS App and download to your phone. Follow the instructions on the app.

Step2: Create an NHS login account

To create an account, you'll need to know your:

- Email address
- Date of birth
- Post code

You will then be able to create a password.

Step 3: 6 digit security code

You will be sent an email containing a 6-digit security code. Enter the 6 digit code in the app.

Step 4: Your NHS number

You will be asked to enter your NHS number if you know it. If you don't, you can enter your full name. You'll be asked your date of birth and postcode.

Once you have submitted this information, the app should be ready for you to use!

Horncastle



This month we're taking a look at the home of our charity, the bustling market town of Horncastle.

Called Banovallum by the Romans, which means wall by the river, it was built as a defensive settlement on the angle of the rivers Bain and Waring; part of the old Roman wall can still be seen at the library. Its modern name, Horncastle, comes from the Saxon name Hyrnecastra. Hyrne, being Old English for a horn shaped piece of land formed in a river bend.

As you walk round the town, you notice how many cafés and pubs there are. The area known as the Bull Ring was once the terminus for horse-drawn coaches, with passengers enjoying a stop at the local posting inns: The Red Lion and The Bull Hotel, both of which are still trading. The King's Head, also at The Bull Ring, is one of the county's original mud and stud buildings and still boasts a thatched roof, giving it the local name of The Thatch.

Other notable buildings and places to visit in the town include the Sir Joseph Banks Centre (Bridge Street) and St Mary's Church (pictured above). Dating from the early 13th Century, the church is a Grade II listed building, featuring a number of architectural styles, including: Gothic, Georgian and Victorian.

Horncastle is probably most famous for its large array of antiques shops and has often featured on BBC One's Bargain Hunt. However, visitors are also drawn to the town's local market (every Thursday and Saturday), farmers' market (the 2nd Thursday of the month), book shops, craft shops and its newest attraction, the Wolds Wildlife Park. Open to visitors April to October, it's a great day out!
