

What's Happening - In Brief

A Note from Amanda Allen (CEO of Age UK NorthWorcs) - July 2025

- There have been several announcements this month that will impact the communities that we support. At the beginning of July the Government launched the NHS ten-year plan, setting out their roadmap for reforming the NHS. The headline proposal in the plan is the development of Neighbourhood Health Services, with the aim of bringing together a range of health and care professionals, based in the community, to better meet people's needs. Other key proposals include increased use of technology, including expanding the functionality of the NHS App. Whilst welcoming the benefits that a Neighbourhood Health Service will bring to older people, in posting its response to the plan, the National Age UK team also raised its concerns about ensuring that no one is left behind, including the many millions of older people who are not online and who often want and need to use more traditional means of contact (including face-to-face and telephone support). It is quite timely, therefore, that at the end of this month, Age UK's Campaign Team is planning to deliver its Offline & Overlooked Petition to 10 Downing Street. With over 6 million older people across the county who either don't have the internet or can't use it successfully and safely, the team have been campaigning to ensure that those who can't or chose not to be online are not locked out of essential service - at the time of writing, over 160,000 signatures have been collected on the petition
- Following the changes to our name and our boundary areas, I have been attending various
 network groups and meetings with the aim of raising our profile across North Worcestershire.
 Meetings held in connection with supporting people living in the Droitwich, Wychbold and
 Hartlebury areas have all been very positive and we are also looking at Retail opportunities in
 Droitwich, which would help us to establish a physical presence, as well as helping to raise funds
 to enable us to expand our work
