The Charity Commission have officially approved (and reflected on their website) our use of Age UK North Worcestershire as trading/ working name, which means that Age UK Bromsgrove, Redditch & Wyre Forest currently remains



as our legal/registered name. We are in the process of reviewing our Charity Constitution and, as part of that process, I will be discussing with the Board whether we want to progress with a full name change or whether we remain as we are now. This month has seen the migration of our website and our emails (our website address is now www.ageuk.org.uk/northworcs/ and our emails now end @ageuknorthworcs.org.uk, with diverts in place for anybody using our previous website and email addresses), as well as updates to our social media accounts.
