### Thank you from Helen Mills - CEO

It is my absolute pleasure as the CEO of Age UK Northumberland to write this piece for Volunteer Matters. I'm delighted that we are able to commit resources to share information with you to ensure that you are kept up to date with what's going on within the organisation.

I've been involved with Age UK Northumberland for the past 16 months as CEO and I'm overwhelmed by the commitment that you make as volunteers to older people lives across the county of Northumberland.

As volunteers you play a key role in helping us meet our three year strategic objectives :

To be the Trusted Adviser of Choice - We've gone through some recent changes at The Round House and have set up a triage model, where all calls are fielded by one of our I&A teamfirst. It is so pleasing to see the I&A team of volunteers grow exponentially in numbers to reflect the increased number of days and hours. Collectively staff and volunteers have generated over £1.5m in welfare benefits gains in the past 12 months and I am absolutely certain that without the dedication and support of the welfare benefits volunteers, we would never have been able to make such a difference to so many older people's lives.

This is what people have said:- "Very impressed with Liz who supported dad with his application for attendance allowance. She was so helpful and enabled us to focus on the information required to successfully gain this benefit. We would have been lost without her guidance."

"Many thanks to Northumberland Age UK and Brian, Welfare Rights Advisor, without who's help and support I would have found great difficulty obtaining the benefits I am entitled to."

Improve Health and Wellbeing - Having spent a couple of weeks in April visiting our day services I was struck by the dedication of those who are supporting our staff to ensure that older people get the best service possible when attending our day services. I'm yet to attend any of the lunch clubs but I've heard such wonderful things about the food and the determined efforts made by the lunch club volunteers in ensuring that older people receive a hot meal and some social interaction each week. Also, through the many and varied exercise groups, wellbeing sessions and IT classes also held across Northumberland, you are helping us reach more older people , enabling them to connect with others and live as independently as they can, for as long as they can.

Protecting and promoting the rights of older people - The advocacy volunteers do an amazing job of supporting individuals who empower older people to have their voice heard on issues that are important to them.

As an organisation it is our desire to reduce loneliness across the County of Northumberland and you provide a vital role in helping us achieve this aim, thank you! Helen





### Spotlight on... I&A

Our team of volunteers have been working hard and are as busy as ever. During 2017, with support from our volunteers, the I&A/Welfare Benefits team have supported 1750 older people who have accessed our Information & Advice phone line and we have secured £1.5m additional benefits for older people across Northumberland.

Our volunteer team also help to run Social Fridays which was featured in our last newsletter. We recently went on our second trip out, to Heighleygate Garden Centre, which was lots of fun and volunteers have already started planning the next trip.

Looking to the year ahead, we have plans to launch a new befriending line and are always looking for more people to join our team of dedicated volunteers. We also hope to open more outreach clinics and continue to improve the reach of I&A in Northumberland. None of this is possible without the support from our volunteer administrators, receptionists, I&A and Welfare Benefits advisers and Social Friday befrienders.

#### **Many Happy Returns Norah**

In March, we shared a very special birthday celebration when one of our retired volunteers turned 100 at the day centre she used to run. Norah White began attending our Amble Day Centre as a service user almost 20 years ago, after taking her well-earned retirement from running the centre as a volunteer for 25 years.

The Day Centre was set up in the early 1970s in the church hall to provide a social group that would offer friendship, support and a good meal to older people in the community. In the beginning the Centre was run totally by volunteers and provided for those in Amble and the surrounding area. In the early 1980s the Day Centre was offered a home in the newly built Dolphin Court, Amble, where it resides today.

Living all her life in the town, Norah is a well-known and loved figure in the community. After being asked by her friends to 'help out' at the centre, Norah thought it would a good opportunity to give something back. She soon become more involved in the organisation and running of the centre but shortly after her 80th birthday she took the decision to step down and hand the reigns to others but not to leave the group.

On her 100th Birthday, Norah enjoyed a party with her friends and family at Dolphin Court and was also visited by Day Services Manager, John Hay [as pictured].
