Our Companion Service makes it possible for older/vulnerable people to still enjoy their life and to do the things that mean something to them with the support of a carefully chosen volunteer companion. Read on to find out how this service had such a positive impact on *Sarah's life.



Sarah is 85 years old and was an early sign-up to our new Companion Service. She was a prominent, independent and active member of her local community and ran a number of shops and family businesses with her husband. Sadly, her husband died a few years ago and her children and their families don't live in close proximity although they are a close-knit family. Living alone in a large house, Sarah found it challenging. Her mobility remains affected by her health conditions and she knows she can be a bit forgetful and confused. The challenges of daily life can be distressing. Sarah and her family were concerned about the decline of her mental health and ability to cope. A detailed conversation with Sarah and her family enabled us to begin the search for the right volunteer to meet Sarah's needs and bring some enjoyment back into her life.

SPOTLIGHT ON TRAVEL FRAUD

With the kids heading back to school you might be on the lookout for a hot summer deal.

However, be cautious of "too good to be true" offers on flights and/or accommodation. Criminals may advertise holiday packages at rock-bottom prices using fake payment pages to obtain your personal and financial information. Remember, if it looks too good to be true, it probably is!

If you are going overseas, make sure your card company has your up-to-date contact details so they can contact you if there is an issue with your card while you are abroad.

Only take debit and credit cards that you intend to use, leave the others securely at home. Always keep your passport, ID and bank card safe when travelling as criminals can try to steal them, or the information on it.

It's also a good idea to keep your bank and credit card company's 24-hour telephone number with you in case you need to contact them while you are away.

If you use a card machine aboard, make sure you cover the machine when you're entering your PIN and check your bank statement when you get home for any transactions you don't recognise.

By talking more openly about suicide, we can give people the chance to express how they feel and get the support they need. It could even save a life.

21st September : World Alzheimer's Day

World Alzheimer's Day is a global opportunity to raise awareness around, educate, encourage support of and demystify dementia. ARE YOU GAS SAFE?

Together with our Warm & Wise service we are proud to be supporting Gas Safety Week 2024, taking place 9th-15th September.

Gas Safety Week is an annual safety week to raise awareness of gas safety and the importance of taking care of your gas appliances. It is coordinated by Gas Safe Register, the official list of gas engineers who are legally allowed to work on gas.

The theme this year is Checking—Every Check Counts.

Badly fitted and poorly serviced gas appliances can cause gas leaks, fires, explosions, and carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning. CO is a highly poisonous gas that can kill quickly and without warning, as you cannot see it, taste it, or smell it. By taking care of your gas appliances properly you are taking care of your home and your loved ones. No matter how big or small every check counts.
