Out & About with John

On the 8th of May a Scam Awareness session was held in conjunction with the Harrow Road Community Group's VE Day celebration. During the event, John gave a brief talk on how to avoid becoming a victim or repeat victim of scams, including those conducted via phone, email, and doorstep interactions.

The session was interactive, with attendees sharing personal experiences of near-misses and, in some cases, actual scam incidents. With their consent, John will be following up with several individuals for one-to-one scam awareness sessions. John also took the opportunity to highlight some of the essential services offered by Age UK Nottingham & Nottinghamshire, which support older and vulnerable adults in our diverse community. Attendees visited the information table to collect leaflets and booklets tailored to their needs. Additionally, John provided volunteering packs that included job opportunities available in May.

A key outcome of the event was securing 17 referrals for the Warm & Wise project, after discussing how it can help individuals improve energy efficiency and reduce utility bills particularly beneficial for those most in need.

ARE YOU READY FOR THE RTS SWITCH OFF?

Monday 30 June 2025, the RTS will switch off. Unless you arrange a replacement with your energy supplier now, your heating and hot water may stop working.

Here's what you need to know.

What do RTS meters do?

RTS meters receive radio signals to switch between different electricity rates or turn certain appliances on or off at specific times.

They were mainly for:

- Economy 7 or Economy 10 tariffs for cheaper night-time electricity.
- RTS-only tariffs like Comfort Plus and Total Heat Total Control.
- Controlling storage heaters or water heaters.

However, the technology that creates the radio signal is outdated and will be switched off on 30 June 2025.

You might have an RTS meter if you:

- Use electric heating to heat your home.
- Have a tariff where the price of electricity changes at different times of day.
- Have a separate box near your electricity meter with the words 'radio teleswitch' or 'radio telemeter'.
- Have two codes on your electricity bill that start with the letter S. These are 'supply numbers' or 'S numbers'.
- Live in a house with no gas connection.

Your electricity supplier might have been in touch with you already via letter about replacing your meter.
