

Applying to Homeshare Oxfordshire

COVID-19 – CORONAVIRUS: We continue to support existing Homeshare matches and welcome enquiries and applications from Householders looking for support, and Sharers seeking accommodation. We are taking all necessary precautions to operate as safely as possible following guidelines, protocols and taking into account the circumstances and needs of each individual. Please do talk to us about this if you need further information.

Homeshare Oxfordshire carefully matches an older person, or couple, looking for help, companionship or reassurance at home, with another person who is happy to lend a hand, and who needs low-cost accommodation. **The Sharer gives the Householder up to 10 hours of their time each week as a combination of companionship and practical help, as agreed.** Each party pays a monthly fee to Homeshare Oxfordshire.

A Homeshare arrangement provides mutual benefit to both 'Householder' and 'Sharer'. In return for the accommodation the Sharer gives the Householder up to 10 hours of their time each week as practical help and/or companionship. The reassuring presence of another person in the house overnight is sometimes important to the Householder too.

Each Homeshare match is individual and carefully agreed. It may include some cooking and light housework, help with computers and technology, maybe some shopping or gardening, arranged time together over shared meal perhaps, or the odd trip out. Sometimes the reassuring presence of having someone else in the house, especially at night, is particularly important. The companionship element of a Homeshare arrangement is often an important aspect for Householder and Sharer alike.

A Homeshare match does not involve any personal care.

Fees and costs

Monthly fees are payable to Homeshare Oxfordshire by Householder and Sharer. These fees cover the costs of setting up the Homeshare arrangement and the regular, ongoing contact and support provided by the Homeshare Oxfordshire team.

The Householder pays £100 per month (which works out at just over £3 per day).

The Sharer pays £200 per month to Homeshare Oxfordshire. The Sharer makes a contribution to the Householder of an agreed amount towards household costs.

The process

Pre-application stage and application form

Before we ask potential Householders and Sharers to complete a full application form, we ask for confirmation that you meet the Homeshare eligibility criteria (see pages 4 & 5). We also ask you to tell us a little about yourselves as well as why you would like to Homeshare.

If you are interested as a Sharer, we need an idea of your daily routine and where you would like to live (including any current opportunities you are interested in).

Please provide the information above via the online form at the bottom of our webpage. www.homeshareoxfordshire.org.uk. If this is not possible, please email or telephone us.

All being well with the stage above, we will then send you the full application form.

Informal interview

If you are a **Householder**, we will visit you at home, to talk more about the Homeshare arrangement and the sort of help or companionship you would like.

If you are **Sharer**, we will also meet you in person to talk more about the sort of Homeshare arrangement that would suit you. Depending on various circumstances, this meeting may need to wait until a suitable Householder has been identified.

If it is not easy to meet in person, we can arrange an initial video call.

References and checks

Safety is central to Homeshare Oxford and we carry out the following checks:

Written References – We take up references for Householders and Sharers.

Disclosure & Barring Service (DBS) Checks - We ask Householders and Sharers to disclose any convictions. We request an enhanced DBS check for Sharers.

Home Safety Checks – Smoke Alarms, Carbon Monoxide Alarms and Gas Safety are all checked. These may well already be in place but if new checks are needed, we can link you to Oxfordshire Fire and Rescue Service and to providers of Gas Safety checks.

Finding the right person for you

We draw up a profile with you which says a bit about you, the things that are important and of interest to you, and the sort of Homeshare arrangement you would like.

Householder profiles detail the sort of help you would like and Sharer profiles the sort of help you can offer. We show your profile to someone who might be a potential match and whom we think you may like to meet.

Introductory meeting

Once a Householder and Sharer have decided they would like to meet each other, we arrange an introductory meeting. It's a chance to meet each other, talk about how the arrangement could work and for the Sharer to see the room and the house. A member of the Homeshare Oxfordshire team is also there.

We ask Householder and Sharer not to make an immediate decision as to whether they would like to go ahead with the Homeshare arrangement, but to let Homeshare Oxfordshire know the following day. Occasionally, a second meeting can be arranged, if both Householder and Sharer would like this.

Drawing up the Homeshare agreement and moving in

Once a decision has been made to go ahead, the specific arrangement is agreed by both parties, documents are signed, a start date is agreed and the Homeshare can begin!

Thereafter.....

The Homeshare Oxfordshire team will keep in regular touch, both in person and over the phone, to support the Homeshare and to ensure that it runs smoothly.

Homeshare Oxford organises several social events each year. These are good opportunities to meet other people involved in Homeshare.

Householder checklist

Before making an application as a Householder, please check that you meet the following criteria.

You are:

- Aged 50 or over and living in Oxfordshire
- Happy to welcome someone, most likely of a different generation to you, into a clean and safe home
- Able to provide a spare bedroom and be happy to share living space
- Looking for up to 10 hours a week of practical help and companionship from the Sharer (this must not involve any personal care)
- Willing to provide contact details of 2 referees
- Willing to tell us about any spent or unspent convictions– they may not automatically exclude you, but we need to know about them
- Able to provide an up-to-date gas safety certificate and have working smoke alarms and carbon monoxide alarms to meet all safety requirements (if needed, we can link you to Oxfordshire Fire and Rescue Service and to providers of gas safety checks)
- Able to meet the monthly fee requirements.

Sharer checklist

Before making an application as a Sharer, please check that you meet the following criteria.

You are:

- Aged 21 or older and looking for accommodation in Oxfordshire
- Eligible to live in the UK
- Have an established clear work/study routine. Please note, it is not easy to find Homeshares for people who work long shifts or night shifts
- Emotionally mature & stable, kind & considerate, clean & tidy
- Someone who would enjoy and value living with an older person or couple
- Happy to provide up to 10 hours of your time each week as practical help and/or companionship to a Householder (no personal care is involved)
- Able to commit to a Homeshare for a minimum of 9 months (though a Homeshare arrangement is usually of a longer duration)
- Able to stay overnight at the property most nights
- Able to provide contact details of 3 referees who would provide references
- Willing to tell us about any spent or unspent convictions (they may not automatically exclude you, but we need to know about them) and undergo an enhanced Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) check
- Able to meet the monthly fee requirements.
