

Thank you for considering leaving a gift in your will. Your kindness could be a lifeline for older people in Plymouth for years to come.

When making or amending your will, we recommend that you speak to a qualified professional, such as a solicitor.

You can choose to leave a residuary gift (a share of your estate after taxes and debts have been paid), a pecuniary gift (a fixed sum of money) or a specific gift (a specific possession such as a painting).

Your solicitor can advise you on the required wording to carry out your wishes. If you would like to leave a kind gift to Age UK Plymouth, please see suggested wording below:

Residuary gift

I give the residue of my estate to Plymouth Age Concern (operating as Age UK Plymouth), The William and Patricia Venton Centre, Astor Drive, Mount Gould, Plymouth, Devon, PL4 9RD (Registered Charity Number 281820) for its general charitable purposes. I further direct that the receipt of the Chief Executive or other proper officer of the said charity for the time being shall be a full and sufficient discharge for the said gift.

Pecuniary/specific bequest

I give the sum of £ ____ (or the item specified) to Plymouth Age Concern (operating as Age UK Plymouth), The William and Patricia Venton Centre, Astor Drive, Mount Gould, Plymouth, Devon PL4 9RD (Registered Charity Number 281820) for its general charitable purposes. I further direct that the receipt of the Chief Executive or other proper officer of the said charity for the time being shall be a full and sufficient discharge for the said gift.

Martin, 81, first came to Age UK Plymouth with a question about his Blue Badge. Since losing his wife three years earlier, he had become increasingly isolated and his mobility had worsened.

When we met him, we identified that he was entitled to Attendance Allowance, increasing his income by £5,740.70 a year, and supported other successful benefit applications.

While this financial support made a big difference, Martin was still struggling with loneliness and anxiety. With gentle encouragement, he began attending our weekly Community Cuppa group. Over time, he built friendships and regained a sense of belonging.

Today, Martin is a familiar face at our centre, where he is warmly welcomed and feels part of his community again.
