Getting to know.....Dr Jane Young

Our newest trustee joins us at a time when health care is changing for all and her expertise is invaluable.

Here's her vision for AUKRuT....



You have been a trustee for a while, how are you finding the role?

I am slowly finding my feet but the organisation is large and varied and I think very successful. I find the staff meetings quite helpful to get a feel of things and meet the employees and volunteers.

As a retired GP, you have a unique insight in to the world of health. Has this helped with your role as a trustee for AUKR? Of course, my role, I think is to become involved with Nightingale.

The Nightingale service seems a natural fit given your experience, but is there another aspect of the organisation with which you have a particular interest?

My interest is in health and patient support. I feel that people's wellbeing is core with keeping mobile and an active interest in hobbies and reading/television. In taking an interest in others' and hobbies, older people particularly who live alone are taken out of themselves. I think the organisation does a lot to achieve this.

Where do you see AUKR in the next few years?

We are told that people are currently living well into their 80's and even 90's in this borough in particular, so AUKR should have a plan for a bigger work load and increased costs. Again, I think diet and exercise and discouraging too much of a sedentary existence is important. The other objective of the organisation is fundraising. This is not an area I am familiar with as my last trusteeship was in an organisation that was endowed. This becomes more complex with pressures on the social service budget and the council conserving its funds and so the challenge for the future is to find other means of funding.

Have you had experience with other voluntary sector organisations?

I was a trustee of Hampton Fuel Allotment Charity for 13 years, this experience has lead to a keen interest in fuel poverty.

How do you like to spend your spare time? I have an interest in music, sing in a London choir and also attend an art group.
