Age UK Rotherham is an independent local charity that works with and for older people in the Metropolitan Borough of Rotherham.

Our aim is to help Rotherham people to maintain their independence and quality of life as they get older. We also aim to give older people the opportunity to take part in activities that will help them to stay healthy and active, maintain social contacts and mix with people from different generations.

Whilst our services are available to all people over the age of 50, our main focus is on supporting people over 65, especially those who are particularly vulnerable due to declining physical or mental health or who face additional barriers such as money problems or lack of family support.

We will work with older people, their carers and other partners to develop and deliver effective and high quality services and activities that improve later life in Rotherham - focusing on addressing the five key priorities identified by older people: Being safe, Staying independent, Feeling less lonely, Keeping healthy and Being connected in the community.

We will engage effectively and work in partnership with older people and their carers in Rotherham to involve them in the development, delivery and evaluation of our work and ensure they have a voice in and can influence decisions about things that matter to them and impact on their lives.

We will work towards being a sustainable and resilient local charity that delivers positive outcomes for older people.

We will be an effectively governed, well run organisation that meets all the legal requirements on us as an Age UK, a local service provider, Charity, Limited Company, employer and volunteering organisation.



## The National Lottery Community Fund Award

In June 2019 we celebrated a National Lottery Community Fund award for providing social and recreational activity groups for at least 240 older people over the next three years, helping them to meet new friends and reduce isolation.

# How we helped older people in Rotherham

During 2019-20 we supported around 5,000 older people, offering a range of services and support to them.

£3.4m



gained in benefits such as Attendance Allowance and Pension Credit, with support from our Information and Advice team.

2,200



older people were supported by our Information and Advice Service, making 7,545 contacts with them.

833



older people were helped by our Hospital Aftercare Service to get back on their feet after a stay in hospital.

125

older people were supported through our help at home services to stay living independently and improving their wellbeing.



## EngAge-ing with the community

10,500



contacts were made with older people across Rotherham through our engagement and outreach work, including EngAge social and activity groups and other activities.

This work supports our activities to reduce loneliness and give a greater voice to older people across the Borough.

## As a result of our work:

- More older people were supported to maintain independent living and a good quality of life.
- More older people were helped to **stay safer** at home and in the community.
- **Fewer** older people felt lonely and isolated.
- More older people stayed active and connected in the community through volunteering and other activities.
- More older people had more money and accessed their full benefits and entitlements.
- More older people had a voice about things that affected them as individuals and as a group.
- More carers (many of whom are older people themselves) were offered **information and support** to help them care.

## Older People's Month October 2019

During Older People's Month 2019 we supported Rotherham Older People's Forum and other partners to provide a focus on older people's issues.

This year we worked with leaders in the arts and creativity sector to celebrate creativity in later life.

We had a lot of fun with wonderful creative elders at our Rotherham Older People's Month conference: 'Creativity and Ageing'.
