A Happy New Year to you all

As you may know by now, we are celebrating our successful application to the Heritage Lottery Fund for development funding to restore The Old Coach House in Hillsborough Park into an older people's activity centre and community café. We now have an amazing opportunity to create a brilliant new dementia-friendly facility for the city.

It isn't certain by any means. We have a huge amount of hard work to do behind the scenes to enable us to ask the Heritage Lottery Fund for the full amount to complete the project. But we feel we have got over a significant hurdle by being successful with our stage 1 funding bid, and are hugely optimistic about delivering this project for older people in Sheffield and the local community in Hillsborough.

Member offers

One of the key pieces of work we will looking at as we develop the Hillsborough Park project is how to link the new facility with our Friends of Age UK Sheffield membership offer. Can we register café users as members? And can we structure the room bookings and café prices to give discounts to Friends of Age UK Sheffield members? It's a key factor in our thinking. We are always looking for ways to add value to your membership. In this edition, you will see we have secured an additional member benefit for you in the shape of discounts in the Sheffield Theatres bar and

café. Royles Coaches have also increased their usual "£2 off" offer to a whopping "£5 off" for the winter period.

If you know of any local offers we could obtain for our members, or any ideas of offers you want us to pursue, please let me know.

Can you help?

Even if we are successful in getting the full grant from the Heritage Lottery Fund, we will still have to raise some local partnership funding to complete the project. The fundraising starts now.

I am hugely grateful to Holly Garforth at the Virgin Money Lounge, who has allocated one of their precious places in the 2019 London Marathon to Age UK Sheffield. Our runner, Wesly Jay will no doubt be going all out to raise as much as possible for us.

Finally, we are seeking 15 runners and 15 volunteer marshals for this year's Sheffield half marathon on Sunday 14th April. If you know anyone who can help us, please contact enquiries@ageuksheffield.org.uk or phone (0114) 250 2850. Marshals will be fully briefed and supported. Runners' places are free but they need to raise a minimum of £100 which will go towards the Old Coach House project.

Coach House Lottery joy



Our plans to redevelop a derelict listed building in Hillsborough Park have received initial National Lottery support*, it was announced in December.

Age UK Sheffield is aiming to renovate the 18th Century Old Coach House building into a dementia-friendly older people's centre, and café open to the entire community. The project has received development funding of £49,700 from the Heritage Lottery Fund. Thanks to National Lottery players this award will enable the local charity to progress the plans and apply for a full National Lottery grant.

The project aims to create a vibrant hub to support dementia-friendly group activities such as singing and dancing, as well as classroom-based activities and educational classes such as digital drop-ins.

The community café will be open to the thousands of local park visitors, including dog-walkers, children's playground users, and Park runners. It aims to provide local employment and

volunteering opportunities in the Hillsborough area and introduce people to the Walled Garden and other heritage within the park.

Age UK Sheffield Chief Executive, Steve Chu, said: "This is absolutely fantastic news. Thanks to National Lottery players we have a real opportunity to develop The Old Coach House into a thriving community venue for older people in Sheffield and local



people in Hillsborough. Importantly, through this project, we can bring back into use a derelict listed building that would otherwise soon be lost."

It comes as Sheffield City Council launched its Building Better Parks strategy where millions of pounds could be invested in Sheffield's parks and public spaces over the next five years.

Councillor Mary Lea, cabinet member for culture, parks and leisure at Sheffield City Council, said: "Hillsborough park is already one of our absolute jewels and plays host to a year-round calendar of

events, activities and social occasions. This is a fantastic project which will help thousands of people across the city and their carers and friends, giving them dignity and support and ensuring they can tackle dementia together in a constructive and compassionate way.

"What's more, this facility will provide vital café and toilet facilities at one of our city's most beautiful and popular parks. We look forward to working with Age UK Sheffield, the Friends of Hillsborough Park and other community groups to help these plans develop further."

About the Heritage Lottery Fund

*HLF Heritage **Enterprise Fund** applications are assessed in two rounds. The Old Coach House has initially been granted round one development funding of £49,700 by the Heritage Lottery Fund, allowing it to progress with its plans. Detailed proposals are then considered by HLF at second round, where a final decision is made on the full funding award of £631,200.

Thanks to National Lottery players, we invest money to help people across the UK explore, enjoy and protect the heritage they care about.

Join the campaign to save free TV for older people

It's not just 'the box in the corner.'

When mobility issues mean you struggle to get out and about, it helps you stay connected. When money is a constant worry, it's your way to escape. And when you spend your days alone, it gives you something to rely on, something to look forward to

For over a million of the oldest people in our society, TV is their main form of company. It's their window on the world, and a human voice when they've not spoken to another person in days.

TV is a lifeline. And right now, it's under threat.

In 2015, the Government quietly pushed the job of providing free TV licences to the BBC - without giving them the funding to do the job properly, or asking us, the public, whether this was right.

Now the BBC is considering removing the right to free TV licences for the over 75s. If this is allowed to happen, it's the most vulnerable people in our society who'll suffer





Who loses out if free TV licences are scrapped?

It's a common misconception that all older people are comfortably off these days. In fact nearly a fifth of over 75s are living in poverty. For them, paying a hefty extra bill would simply be impossible when they're barely scraping by as it is.

Added to this, half of over 75s are living with a disability. Many of them rely on their TV for companionship and entertainment. And for those who don't have the internet – a considerable proportion of the oldest in our society – TV enables them stay up to date with what's happen-ing in the world.

Removing access to free TV for the over 75s would be a cruel blow to those who need it most, when they're already facing such huge challenges.

Sign the petition to save free TV

We believe it's the Government's responsibility to look after vulnerable older people. Keeping TV free for them is a simple but vital way to do this.

That's why Age UK is petitioning the Government to take back responsibility for providing free TV licences for over 75s. We need as many signatures as possible to make our case and show how important this issue is.

VOLUNTEER PROFILE Eleanor Wheeler

University of Sheffield student Fleanor is a volunteer on our In Touch befriending service. Here she tells us why she volunteers with Age UK Sheffield, and what the henefits are

How did you first get involved in volunteering for us?

After seeing a video online about loneliness in elderly people my heart was broken. I instantly wanted to get involved and do my little bit to help. Volunteering for Age UK Sheffield has been such a rewarding experience which has truly opened my eyes and made me realise that a small act such as popping in to see someone for a chat and a cup of tea can have a huge impact on others.

It means a lot to me because I am very blessed and lucky to be surrounded by amazing friends and family who

I don't know what I'd do without, so it upsets me to think of anyone feeling alone and isolated. It is amazing that Age UK provides a way for people to do something about Ioneliness

What have been the rewards and challenges?

I really enjoyed visiting Rosemary - she loved a laugh and we got on very well. We bonded over handbags and dogs and built a lovely friendship! As a university student in Sheffield I love the city and had experienced the student lifestyle, but befriending someone who has spent their whole life growing up here was



extremely interesting for me. Rosemary taught me a lot about Sheffield and told me lots of stories from when she was young. I enjoyed hearing about the city that I'm now living in from someone else's perspective and her stories.

It was challenging when she would become down or frustrated at the fact she wasn't able to get out and about and socialise. Sometimes I felt helpless that there was nothing I could do to improve the situation but I think just being there to listen to her struggles and try to cheer her up was still better than



had I not been there at all.

Grace thought it was hilarious and I was worried how I'd get everyone back to the car. Ziggy was too heavy to sit on Grace's lap, so we put Ziggy in the wheelchair, which I pushed and Grace held onto for balance. We slowly made our way back to the car but had to stop every so often to explain to other dog walkers why the dog was fast asleep in a wheelchair!

Grace was a very sociable lady so she enjoyed chatting to everyone in

the park. With time her mobility got worse, but I still visited and she used to say: "Do you remember when we took that dog out in the wheelchair" which always set us off laughing.

What you would say to anyone who is interested in doing it?

To anyone interested in volunteering for Age UK Sheffield. I would definitely advise getting involved. The only thing I regret is not doing so sooner. We can all spare a small piece of our time to help someone else. Who doesn't love a cuppa and a gossip?!



New 'Carer Card' gives little extras to Sheffield's unpaid carers

Do you look after a family member, neighbour of friend who could not manage without your support?

The Sheffield Carer Card has been developed to reward and recognise all the hard work you do as an unpaid Carer. The Carer Card offers discounts on a range of activities, products and services donated by businesses in Sheffield and beyond. It is also to be used in case of an emergency situation so that if you are incapacitated or involved in an emergency situation, the card highlights who to contact in order that the person you care for is looked after.

The Card was launched on 30 November and is now available to all carers who register (or are already registered) with Sheffield Carers Centre. Being registered also means a carer receives the Centre's newsletter and access to support and advice services.
