Here to help rain, hail or sunshine



By the time you read this, it's likely that the heatwave from the Summer is but a distant memory and we start to turn our thoughts towards Winter.

The team here at Age UK Solihull are here to help our clients - whatever the weather. But at certain times of the year, our efforts turn to helping the vulnerable during weather extremes.

Our help was needed in May this year, when a month's worth of rain fell in just one hour, causing many Solihull residents to have the terrible experience of their homes being flooded. In many cases, possessions were lost, furniture and rooms damaged and many homes became uninhabitable.

The team sprang into action, along with Solihull Council and visited the 80 most affected

households to offer help with ligising with insurance companies, trades people and in some cases, to support rehousing the resident.

Then during the heatwave, we offered support and advice to our clients about keeping cool and hydrated, with a downloadable heatwave checklist available from our website.

We have been delivering the Solihull Winter Warmth Campaign on behalf of Solihull Council since 2008. We can help with general information and advice and support in emergency situations such as delivery of emergency heaters. We can also help with arranging tradesmen to repair plumbing, gas and electrical problems.
