

We recently discovered that some of our supporters are not aware that we are a **local charity**, how much it costs to provide our services (**£1.6m**), or where our funding comes from (75% from Solihull Council and the local NHS Clinical Commissioning Group and 25% through voluntary income including **donations and gifts in Wills**). We have produced six bookmarks with key facts about the charity on to try and raise awareness about how we operate. Look out for them at our shops and out in the community.

Running for good



We recently joined forces with **GoodGym Solihull** to support more vulnerable older people living in our ocal community.

GoodGym volunteers keep fit whilst helping people. They run to older people's houses and act as a Befriender, providing support and companionship. They call the older people they run to 'coaches' as they motivate the volunteers to make a regular run.

They also undertake 'Mission Runs' when they run to older people to help them with one-off tasks they are unable to do for themselves such as changing a lightbulb, some light gardening or moving furniture.

Volunteers also complete 'Group Runs' where they run to various locations and help with community projects. Tasks have previously included painting our Solihull charity shop.

The care we want



We have been working with the University of Birmingham on a project exploring the experiences 🚽 of older people who pay for their

own care and that of their carers. A group of Age UK Solihull volunteers has been working as coresearchers to conduct interviews with older people and their carers, and with service providers and commissioners. Partnership has been at the heart of the project, with excellent cooperation and interest from Solihull MBC plus several local care agencies, and of course from older people themselves. The researchers would like to say a big thank you to all of them.

Four 'Knowledge Exchange' meetings have been held between statutory, private and voluntary sector services, and a fifth is due to be held in September. These useful events have informed local providers of some of the experiences of older self-funders, and there have been some changes in how things are done locally as a result.

The University has also secured funds from the Economic and Social Research Council to hold a public event called 'The Care We Want', which will highlight the research. It



will feature a team of experts from local organisations discussing what care means, some of the problems that older people and their families face when purchasing care, and ideas about how these can be tackled. Co-researchers from the project will also be present at the event, making sure that the voices of older people are heard. The event will be held on Friday 8 November 2019 from 2-4pm at the Crowne Plaza Hotel. Solihull. It is free to attend but numbers are limited, so please register your place at:
