

A Day to Remember



Our **Linking Veterans Together (LVT)** project has recently come to an end, after 2 years of aiming to **tackle loneliness** and **improve wellbeing** in older **veterans and their spouses** living in Solihull.

Joe Seager, one of the **355** people who benefited from the project, wrote the piece below after their last trip to the **National Memorial Arboretum**.

Of all the hugely popular LVT trips, the visit to the National Memorial Arboretum had a special meaning for people enjoying one of Age UK Solihull's many notable ventures to serve the interests of elderly members of the community.

The chance to see superbly crafted materials created to honour the lives of members of the armed forces enabled many of us to recall our own time in military service.

One of the guests in the coach party left his home in Trinidad to support Britain's war-time campaign in the 1940s. And no sooner had he returned from the visit to the Arboretum, than he was taken to a military base in Yorkshire to receive a medal awarded to recognize the

gallant part played by 5,000 West Indians in our war effort.

So there was good reason to thank Age UK Solihull for making the visit one to enjoy on a very high note and provide time to reflect on sacrifices made at our time of need. It was, in every sense, a day to remember.

Nothing could spoil the day, not even enormous traffic jams that kept us on the road for two hours making the short journey from Solihull to the Staffordshire home of the Arboretum.

Everything went well from the moment we arrived. A splendid meal in a room reserved for the 22 members of the group was followed by a well-accounted commentry to guide us along a train-operated system to see many of the memorial sites positioned across vast acres of a truly remarkable national centre of remembrance.

We were all pleased to give Louise (LVT Project Manager) special thanks for another wonderful LVT event—the eighth one she has organised with great care and diligence. She was again ably assisted by teams of volunteers giving up their time to help people with restricted mobility and other support needs. I hope to stay in touch with other members of the project.

Our Digital Champions project



Our **Digital Champion Project** is going from strength to strength, now offering several **digital skills courses** throughout North and South Solihull, including at our newsletter sponsors, **Eastcote Park Retirement Village** (left).

We have also started running **drop-in sessions** that older people can bring their **smartphone, tablet** or **laptop** to for advice and support with using them.

Beth (pictured right with Volunteer, Stephen and another Digital Champion client, Paul) approached us as she wanted to **improve her confidence** with digital skills as she felt it would help her to become more **independent** and enable her to **keep in touch** with family in Ireland.

She joined one of our **friendly courses** and was issued a **tablet to borrow** for eight weeks.

During the course, Beth learned how to **access wifi, use email, search for information** and shop **online**. She now feels **confident** with online shopping and has purchased items for herself and gifts for her grandchildren. She competently **uses email** and does regular **internet research**.

Beth says, *"I would have liked a longer course because I really enjoyed it. I was made to feel at ease and everyone representing Age UK Solihull were brilliant."*

We are **so pleased** to have helped Beth gain **confidence** with her digital skills.

The vehicle has been named after **Cynthia Leonard MBE**, who was one of Age UK Solihull's founders 40 years ago, and our Vice-Chair until she passed away in 2015.

Cynthia's son, **Mike Leonard**, cut a ribbon to

officially unveil the vehicle at Solihull Fire Station, where it is to be kept. Mike said, *"We were delighted to hear that Age UK Solihull has invested in this electric people carrier, named after my late mother who did so much to help improve the lives of so many people in Solihull."*

Age UK Solihull is 40!



"40 years and still working hard to make Solihull a great place to grow old"

A message from our Chief Executive Officer, Anne Hastings:

Looking back over the years, it is interesting to remember that **Age Concern** had its origins during the **Second World War**, which made life more difficult for older people in many ways but also revealed their existing problems, particularly the unsuitability of the Poor Law Provision. Over the years, Age Concern's authority and influence have grown steadily at national and local levels.

1983 was the year in which the formal constitution of **Age Concern Metropolitan Borough of Solihull** was adopted. This was largely due to the efforts of a local Councillor, **Miriam Harris**, together with a Castle Bromwich resident, **Shirley Hutton**, who had already set up an Age Concern there. Over the years, the Charity has been firmly established as the **largest voluntary organisation working with and for older people** in the borough. It became a

company limited by guarantee in 1996, when it also became known as **Age Concern Solihull**. In 2009, Age Concern England and Help the Aged merged to become a new charity named **Age UK**, and Age Concern Solihull became a **brand partner**, and now trades under the name **Age UK Solihull**.

The provision of **direct services** and **campaigning to promote positive attitudes** towards older people and ageing were the aims of the first committee 40 years ago and remain our aims today. Our vision is **a world where older people flourish**, and our mission is **to improve the lives of all older people in the borough of Solihull**. We do this through a wide range of services and support and while some of these have changed over the years, what hasn't changed is the **amazing dedication** of our **staff** and **volunteer teams** to **making life better** for older and vulnerable people in the community.

We are **grateful** for all the help and support we get and look forward to the next 40 years with **hope and enthusiasm** that we will be here when we are needed. **Happy 40th Birthday to us!**

Help with the cost of living

We are administering the **Household Support Fund** for Solihull residents of **State Pension Age** who are on **low incomes** and struggling **with the cost of living**. The types of support available may include:

- Access to **food**
- Items to help you **keep warm** e.g. electric blankets, duvets
- Essential **household items** e.g. cooker, fridge, bed
- **Energy Debt**
- **Energy/Fuel Top-Up Vouchers**
- **Other essential support** that falls within the scheme criteria

We also joined **Shirley Lions' Father Christmas** and his sleigh around the streets of Shirley, collecting donations on two evenings in December. **£500** was raised for Age UK Solihull from the two evenings.



The **Rotary Club of Knowle & Dorridge** generously purchased **£1,600** worth of heaters and electric blankets for our **Winter Warmth Campaign** which supports Solihull households who are at risk during the winter months.



52 chocolate bouquets, created by **Starlight Hampers**, were raffled off by various companies, groups and individuals, raising **£1,200** profit, and our **Christmas Raffle** raised a record **£1,257**. General **donations** from generous **supporters** totaled over **£1,000** during the festive period.

We were **blown away** by what was achieved with the **support of the Solihull community** over the festive period. We are **so grateful** to everyone who helped raise this incredible amount.

We have helped **hundreds of Solihull residents** to be **over £3m better off** thanks to our **Benefits Service**.

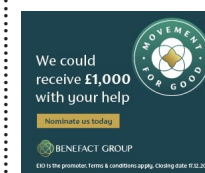


Our **highly-trained staff and volunteers** help residents find out what benefits they are entitled to, and supports them with applications.
