Exercise helps Jean enjoy life again



Jean (left) had always led an active life.

She had been a **keen gardener** and worked 37 different jobs in her lifetime, with her most unique position being working in a trumpet factory.

However, Jean's health began to deteriorate after having brain surgery followed by a stroke, which affected her balance. She had to stop gardening, and she struggled with daily tasks like hanging the washing out, getting clothes out of her wardrobe, cooking and cleaning.

Jean had started to suffer with **anxiety** and had begun to feel wary of going out. She found it difficult to get in and out of a car, and she also struggled to get in and out of a chair.

Jean had **several falls**, and was referred to our Postural Stability Instruction (PSI) service after suffering a major fall in 2021.

Shortly after beginning the PSI programme, Jean began to see an **improvement in her energy levels** and began to feel **more confident** about leaving the house. She was able to walk further, and getting in and out of the car also became easier thanks to an improvement in Jean's strength and balance.

Jean says that the **social interaction** at the classes and **getting out of the house** gave her a real **boost in motivation and confidence**. She has enjoyed meeting new friends and is now feeling much happier about life.

Jean can now confidently get from sitting to standing with little effort, and **finds daily tasks much easier**. She can lift a pot of potatoes off the stove, reach up into cupboards, fasten her buttons and wash her hair - all things she **struggled with** before completing the PSI programme.

Jean also says that one of the parts of the course she found most beneficial was being shown how to **get up off the floor** if she did have another fall. This gave her the **knowledge and confidence** to know what to do if she ever was in that situation.

Jean says, "It was nice of all the volunteers to help and they were all very friendly- there was always somebody to help at the class, which made me feel very confident."

She is much **more happy** now and looking forward to a **better life** than before. She will be carrying on with the **exercises at home** and now attends a follow-on class after completing the initial 20week course.
