




### Less than a week to go until our Christmas Carol Service!


We hope you can join us for our favourite event of the year at magnificent Wells Cathedral on

# Cost-of-living support available for Somerset residents this winter



A range of support is available to help Somerset residents struggling due to the cost-of-living crisis this winter.

Somerset Council is again distributing funds from the Government and working in partnership with local charities and community groups to offer a broad selection of essential free support measures for local people.

### With support from the Household Support Fund, Age UK Somerset offers the following services for people over 60:

- Free eligibility checks for <u>benefits</u> and, if eligible, volunteer support to help complete benefit claim forms. (Last year, this brought an additional £5m into the local economy through claimed benefits)
- A free <u>Information and Advice</u> service, accessible by phone, email, or in person via appointments at their Taunton office. The service covers a wide range of topics, including support with care, finances, activities in your local area, and guidance on accessing help from other organisations.
- A free Chat and Map service, offering a one-stop-shop approach to resolving issues that may affect an older person's quality of life. The service treats everyone as individuals and includes a home visit by a member of staff.
   Through a friendly chat, they will explore what challenges might be impacting daily life, such as rising bills, feelings of isolation, or difficulties coping at home. Whatever the issues, we will work hard to find solutions. These may involve connecting the client with other Age UK Somerset services, making referrals to external organisations, or providing tangible goods.
- A free <u>Wellbeing service</u> to help reduce loneliness and isolation, especially during the darker months. This includes the company of a friendly volunteer through programmes such as Friendly Phonecalls, Walk and Talk, or Wellbeing Friends.

These services are proudly supported by Somerset Council via the Household Support Fund.

# **Surviving Winter Grants**

Once again this year, our **Information and Advice Team** will be working in partnership with the **Somerset Community Foundation** to distribute *Surviving Winter Grants* across the county.

We are able to offer grants of up to £300 per household to older people who may be struggling to keep warm and well during the colder months.



To be eligible, individuals should meet the following criteria:

- Be a resident of Somerset (excluding BANES and North Somerset)
- Be aged over 60
- Be likely to struggle to maintain a reasonable standard of living this winter
- Be eligible for Pension Credit (even if not currently claiming it)
- Have any health conditions
- Live in a hard-to-heat home

Our Information and Advice Officers hold the application forms and can send these to anyone

who meets the criteria.

# Diving into Dreams: Age UK Somerset CEO Phil Dolan Earns Scuba Certification at 69

In a powerful reminder that age is no barrier to adventure, Phil Dolan, CEO of Age UK Somerset, has earned his PADI scuba diving accreditation just four months shy of his 70th birthday.

Phil's journey began with a "try dive" in Cyprus last year, where he first experienced the magic of the underwater world. Inspired by the experience and driven by curiosity, he spent the winter completing his online theory training.

In October, he traveled to Kenya to finish his open water dives, officially becoming a certified scuba diver.

"I was taken with the fact that 70% of the world is underwater," Phil said. "If you want to see beyond the 30%, you've got to dive."





Phil's story is more than a personal triumph - it's a bold statement against ageism. As the head of an organisation dedicated to supporting older adults, he's proving first hand that later life can be a time of growth, exploration, and new beginnings.


During a "Mystery" visit the judges were impressed not only with the facilities and services on offer but the warm and welcoming approach of Noah's Arks staff members.



Prevention team because the effects of a fall
on an older person can be devastating. Falls
are a major cause of disability and the
leading cause of mortality due to injury in
older people aged over 75 in the UK.

Our '**Strong and Steady'** exercise programme is designed specifically to prevent falls, consisting of leg muscle strengthening and balance retraining exercises. These effective and sociable sessions take place across Somerset and North Somerset.


# If you are you looking for a New Year's Resolution we can help!

# Celebrating Excellence in Advice!






# Back a Winner: Look Out for Age UK Somerset at Taunton Races in January

We want to make sure local older people's voices are heard.






We are very fortunate to have as our Patron, Dr Lucy Pollock.
