Support to help you remain independent

Care Needs Assessment - Local Authority

This usually involves an occupational therapist visiting you at home to discuss your needs. As a result of the free assessment, the local authority can provide:

- a report of what the needs are (this can help you make decisions about care and support)
- up to £1,000 of free aids, equipment and minor adaptations, regardless of finances. This could include items like grab rails, ramps, bath seats. A 'Disabled Facilities Grant' may be available for larger adaptations.
- Means-tested funding towards a care package (usually an individual must have less than £23,250 in capital)

Planning ahead

Power of Attorney and Wills

A Power of Attorney is a way of giving someone you trust the legal authority to make decisions for you, if you can't make them yourself – or if you don't want to. You can only create one if you have mental capacity to do so and you haven't been put under any pressure. You can get information and forms from Office of the Public Guardian. Tel 0300 456 0300 www.gov.uk/power-of-attorney.

A will can help ensure your wishes for your estate are carried out. For example, that your money, property, possessions and investments go to the people and causes you care about. You may be able to write a lower-cost will through a reputable charity scheme. Seek legal advice from a specialist solicitor if unsure.

Saving you money

One-off grants for individuals

Age UK Southampton can help eligible clients apply for grants in the region of up to £300 to help with household essentials, unexpected bills, heating costs. You must be on a low income and unable to afford the expense. Grants cannot be paid retrospectively. Turn2Us (www.turn2us.org.uk) has a database of grants.

Support to help you remain independent

Support for Carers

A carer can request a free local authority Carer's Assessment if their caring role is having a significant impact on their wellbeing. As a result of the assessment help could be provided including: help with caring role, respite care, aids, support groups, carer's emergency card. The local authority may help fund some of this.

Saving you money

Income maximisation check

Age UK Southampton offer a free check to ensure you are maximising your entitlement to benefits and other financial help; we can even help you apply. If you have health problems or are a carer there may be extra non-means-tested money available.

Council Tax Discount (non means-tested)

You may qualify for a discount from your local council depending on your household. For example, if you are a carer (who is caring for someone other than your spouse); or if you have made significant adaptations to your home due to disability; or if someone has a cognitive or memory impairment.

Saving you money

Southern Water discount

Offer a ~20% discount if you receive Pension Credit, or everyone in your household receives only State Pension. If your household income is less than £21,000 you may also qualify for a discount of 20-90% off your bills

NHS low income scheme

If you have less than £16,000 in savings and are on a low income, or if you receive certain means-tested benefits, then you could qualify for help with NHS help with health costs such as glasses, dentists, hospital travel costs. Tel: 0300 330 1343.



Warm Home Discount

If you receive a means-tested benefit such as Pension Credit or Housing Benefit, then you could get £150 credit to help with your fuel bills. Schemes are open around August - February annually.
