Making Meaningful Connections

Four new social network groups have recently started through Age UK Sunderland.

The new **LGBT+ Group** meets every other Monday in Sunderland. The group aims to encourage LGBT+ people over 50 to socialise and engage in activities and conversation. The LGBT+ Group organises social events and if required one to one support can also be available. A Lesbian Only Group meets on the alternative Monday's.

The **Sunderland Pride Development Group** meets every Thursday morning at the Sunderland Pride Centre. You can engage in a programme of activities with the aim of being part of the Pride Development group and ensure that the voices of older LGBT+ people are heard.

The **Living Positively Social Group** is for older people living with HIV and AIDS and provides an opportunity to meet for coffee, conversation and support. Advice is also available. This group meets fortnightly in Sunderland.

The Men in Big Sheds volunteering project sees Age UK Sunderland working in partnership with the North East Land, Sea and Air Museum (NELSAM). The project provides an opportunity over a 10 week period to learn to restore important artefacts such as WW2 fire engines, military vehicles, airplanes, ships and more – While supporting your local community and meeting new friends. The museum is located on the site of the old airport near the Nissan factory.
