ing stories. She used to tell me all about her days working as a nurse, living in America, volunteering, becoming the manager of a care home and even flying a plane!

Gloria was also a very talented artist, and showed me all of the beautiful landscapes she had sketched. She was a mesmerising personality and I had an incredible amount of respect for her. Not long after I moved to Sunderland, I had the unfortunate news that Gloria had sadly passed away, aged 94, and I was devastated. Gloria was definitely an inspiring person; thinking about her appreciation and friendship makes me remember why I love working with older people so much.

Taking part in Run Your Age enabled me to raise £205 for Age UK, and between the 1st and 31st of January I completed the full 21km! I know I will have made her proud.
