- Installation of energy efficient measures (for example Draft excluders, Door Brush seals, Radflex radiator foil, Hot water cylinder Jacket, Insulation foam and low energy light bulbs)
- > Providing guides relating to energy efficiency and keeping warm in Winter
- > Signposting you to other Services where appropriate

Fuel Poverty in Runnymede and Spelthorne:

- Spelthorne and Runnymede are the two most deprived Boroughs within Surrey.
- 17.4% of Spelthorne's Borough is over 65 (the 4th highest within all 11 Surrey boroughs).
- 2.4% of Spelthorne's Borough is over 85 (8th lowest within all 11 Surrey Boroughs).

• Spelthorne is ranked 1st with 3.2% of people with bad or very bad health, and ranked 2nd with 6.4% of people with day to day activities limited a lot by long term illness or disability.

About Age UK Surrey:

Age UK Surrey is an independent local charity. We work across Surrey to help improve the lives of older people. Our services are designed to enable older people remain independent and informed, healthy and active and connected to their communities. We help combat loneliness and social isolation.

Numbers of people over 85 continues to grow in Surrey:

- A 25% rise since 2001;
- 32,300 people in this age group (2014).

- In 2012 there were 15,456 people in Surrey living with dementia, predicted to rise to 19,000 by 2020.
