



DEVELOPING DEMENTIA SUPPORT IN SURREY

Every person living with dementia deserves compassion, stimulation, connection - and support from services that make a real difference. At Age UK Surrey we are committed to offering just that.

At present, there are approximately 17,700 people living with dementia in Surrey. That number is projected to increase by over 25-28% by 2030, reaching around 22,600 people. These figures underpin why strong, well-supported dementia services are so important in our communities.

Our **Memory Lane Service** uses an evidence-based approach called Maintenance Cognitive Stimulation Therapy (MCST).

The group therapy programme is designed for people with mild to moderate dementia. It is the only non-drug treatment specifically recommended by NICE (the National Institute for Health and Care Excellence) to improve cognition, independence, and wellbeing in people with mild to moderate dementia.

Typically, MCST runs as a weekly group session of one to two hours. Each session follows a theme or topic, and includes a mix of meaningful, stimulating activities. Activities may include:

- Discussions and group conversation (current or past events, reminiscence)
- Word games, quizzes, puzzles, number/word challenges
- Creative and musical activities
- Physical activities or gentle movement, often to support engagement and wellbeing

The group environment is supportive and social: people build friendships, share experiences, benefit from contact, and often report increased confidence, feeling less isolated, better communication, and sometimes improvements in memory or mental sharpness.

Your Will, Your Wishes



Your will, your wishes – don't die intestate! Research from the Money and Pensions Service (MaPS) shows that 53% of adults aged 50-64 and 22% of those aged 65 and over do not have a will. A person who dies without a will is known as 'dying intestate'. This can make sorting out their estate more complicated and lengthy because the law decides who inherits according to certain criteria called 'intestacy rules'.

Research by the Co-operative Legal Services highlights the main reasons people haven't decided to make a will: Almost two fifths (41%) of adults say they 'haven't got around to it', over a quarter (26%) don't believe they have anything of any value and one fifth (20%) think they are too young. There are also one in ten people (12%) who have put off making a will because they 'don't like thinking about death'.

Having a will and keeping it up-to-date helps ensure that your wishes can be respected and your property and assets benefit people and causes you care about. When leaving a gift in your will to a charity, you can state whether you'd like to donate a fixed amount, a specific item, or whatever sum of money remains once the other gifts have been distributed. You choose an Executor to carry out the instructions you leave in your will. We would always recommend that you speak to a qualified professional such as a solicitor, when making or amending your will.

Make a free will

We have partnered with will writing provider Octopus Legacy so you can write or update your will for free online in the comfort of your own home, alternatively you can arrange a face to face home visit.
