

At Age UK Tameside we pride ourselves in offering free 'Information & Advice' to all qualifying local residents. This unique service has proved very popular since its beginning and now sees upwards of thirty people a week, therefore demand for this service is very high.

Information&Advicehavetwofull-timestaff and 2 part-time volunteers and an average enquiry at our 'drop-in' sessions lasts approximately 15-30 minutes per client, leading on to booked appointments lasting anything from 2-3 hours plus follow-up work upwards of 6 hours each week per client.

Whether you want to find information for yourself, a family member or someone you know, we're here to help, and we have staff and volunteers who speak community languages such as English, Gujerati, Urdu, Punjabi and Bangla.

We have full disability access into and around our centre and all consultations are held in private rooms for confidentiality. We are take data protection very seriously and your information is not supplied to outside agencies without your consent. Home visits can also been arranged for those who are housebound and their carers, with the same attention to detail and confidentiality.

We also have a collection of free Information Guides for you to take away with you if you prefer, just call in to our reception to enquire.

Our Information & Advice service is becoming very popular and this may lead to longer than normal waiting times for booked appointments, therefore in the first instance it may be better to contact them by telephone or email, or by attending one of the drop-in sessions held each week. Volunteer Voice

ERIC'S CORNER

Eric is one of our longest serving volunteers here at Age UK Tameside and he has kindly agreed to pen a column for us each issue. This issue it takes a look at one of his lasting childhood memories.



Meeting Eric; if you haven't been introduced to Eric you have missed out on an inspirational man, we are going to put together a series of writings about his childhood, his life and his life's work, which he has been dedicated to for well over 60 years. Eric was born in India. His birth name is Eruch Jamshedji Cavsji, but he is known as Eric to his friends.

Eric arrived in England and started working shortly after at British Rail from 1955-1984 taking early Retirement.

In Sept 1985 Eric took advantage of the new 'Enterprise Allowance' Scheme and became 'self employed, as a book keeper, he worked for the Civil Service for four weeks.

Eric kept his small business going and volunteered some of his time to the adult literacy and numeracy department at Hyde College, based at Union St until it closed in 1992.

A colleague of Eric's at Hyde College talked to him about volunteering for Age UK, known then as Age Concern, he joined the charity's insurance trading until it closed earlier this year, and is still a volunteer for the charity today some 26 years later.

Paul Burgess - 131 Club



I was born in 1969 in Limeside, Oldham, to a working class couple, Joan & Cyril, and was the 4th and final of their children. I joined Oldham Theatre Workshop at age 10 and the bug bit hard. I have been working in and out of both entertainment and health all of my life. I have been a Drag Artist since the early 80's and have also acted in many music videos and short films.

I spent 8 years working as a health trainer for the NHS, and during that same time I founded a theatre company called Pink Triangle Theatre. We specialised in tackling homophobia and transphobia in Schools, Colleges and

Prisons, our work taking us all over the country over a six year period.

The show that we produced and perfumed has been seen by over 11,000 people across the nation. We also wrote and made a short film called 'Dear Alan – A tribute to Alan Turing', which you can still see on YouTube (https://goo.gl/EH4aTi).

I met my husband Jason in 1997 during an Oldham College performance of a play called 'The Tree that holds up the Sky'. We became a couple not too long after and eventually married in 2009. This year, 2018, we have been a couple for 21 years, married for 9 years.

Together we run two non-profit organisations, 'Performance Plaza' and 'Cycle Club Oldham', both

of them founded in 2005. We also run a YouTube channel and Facebook page called 'Those Vegan Guys'. I run another YouTube and Facebook too, 'The Vegan Queens'. (You are welcome to check all those out too)

Thus far I'm loving my job as a Well-Being Assistant here at the 131 Club. Who wouldn't love a job in which you can freely sing and you get to make people smile and laugh often?

"Linda and Janet, our housekeepers, work closely with me to ensure the building is clean, well presented, and meets health and safety standards.






Under The Sea Word Wheel




This Under The Sea themed word wheel is made from a 9 letter Under The Sea themed word. Try and find that word, then make as many words of any length as you can from these letters. You can only use each letter once, and each word must include the letter **S**.



The aim of an arithmagon is to work out which numbers go in the empty circles. The numbers in the square boxes are made by adding together the numbers in the circles either side. For example, if the number in the square box was 10 you could try 6 and 4, but the numbers must also add up on the other edges, making this more difficult than it first appears.


